# PEACE & CONFLICT

## in NORTHERN IRELAND

### PROGRAM

This course study will examine the historical, political, and religious roots of Northern Ireland's conflict. The focus of study will also include an analysis of the area's cultural traditions and exploration into the ways in which this divided society copes with the attendant political, economic, and social problems. Prospects for continued and sustainable peace in this region will also be examined. Prominent academic, political, and community leaders will conduct the lecture sessions.

### FACULTY LEADER

Terrie is the Program Coordinator and an instructor for the Graduate and Undergraduate Certificates in Conflict Resolution at Kansas State University. She holds a Master's Degree in Conflict Analysis and Resolution. Terrie also works as a mediator at the School Family Studies and Human Services' Family Center. Besides teaching Terrie serves as the Facilitation Coordinator at K-State's Institute for Civic Discourse and Democracy.

### ELIGIBILITY

Sophomore standing and minimum 2.5 GPA.

### CREDIT

This course is offered for three (3) hours of undergraduate or graduate credit (FSHS 700).

### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

There will be orientation and pre-departure lectures will be held starting February 11 to March 4. Students will be expected to read historical and social background materials about the conflict and peace building. Students are also required to write a final paper and attend all classes and scheduled events. There will be one post-study tour debriefing on April 3.

### OBJECTIVES

- Understand the background of conflict in Northern Ireland through chronologies, research, and murals.
- Examine key events of the conflict and their impact on outcomes, e.g., civil rights campaign, hunger strikes, peace process.
- Explore key issues of conflict, i.e. politics, political parties, administration of justice, policy initiatives, education, employment, violence, gender, parades, and post conflict reconstruction.

### PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

- Walking tour of Walls and Murals of Derry, Museum of Free Derry, and St. Columb's
- Day trip to Donegal, Republic of Ireland, Grianan Ailich Fortress
- Day trip to Belfast
- Tour of "Peace Line & Murals"
- Visit Stormont (Parliament)
- Day trip to Northern Coast and Giant's Causeway, a World Heritage Site, Messendun Temple, Dunluce Castle, and Carrick-a-Rede Ropp

### COST

**Program Fees:** \$2,710.83 Fee includes international airfare, accommodations, in-country transportation, admission to sites, study abroad fee, and international medical insurance

**Tuition and Fees:** Estimated tuition and fees for 3 credits. Division of Continuing Education (DCE) Fee: \$21.50

**Anticipated Additional Expenses:** Individual meals, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, books, and passport fee
