Writing Marathon

Study Abroad Program

PROGRAM

This program is geared toward graduate students and individuals who already have their graduate degrees. It provides them with the opportunity to study writing in London. Graduate hours may be applied to their degree with approval. Participants will have the opportunity to explore London in small groups. They will spend four days involved in group activities, writing prompts, and sharing their writing pieces with the group.

FACULTY LEADER

Dr. F. Todd Goodson is an Associate Professor in K-State University's College of Education. Dr. Goodson is the Director of the Flint Hills Writing Project, which is a site for the National Writing Project, hosted by Kansas State University. In the summer of 2007, Dr. Goodson led a study abroad group to the "Writing Marathon" in London.

CREDIT

Three credits of graduate level credit for EDCI 786: Topics in Education: London Writing Marathon

ELIGIBILITY

Minimum GPA 2.5 and instructor permission required

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

This class is a unique opportunity to take the National Writing Project's "Writing Marathon" model to the next level. Throughout the experience, students will have a series of structured writing prompts and sharing time. Additionally, as per the marathon model, students will be expected to explore their new surroundings in small groups, writing and sharing throughout the day. Several weeks after the group returns to Manhattan, students will present their final portfolios and share their experience with participants of the 2009 summer institute.

COST

Program Fees Collected by the KSU Study Abroad Program: \$1,811 (includes international airfare, KSU study abroad fee, and international health insurance)

Tuition and Fees: Tuition and fees for 3 graduate credits. Division of Continuing Education Fee \$21.50. If students choose not to take this course for academic credit, they will be assessed a \$250 non-credit participant fee in lieu of KSU tuition and fees.

Anticipated Additional Expenses: Lodging, host country transportation, passport fee, meals, events/tours/admissions, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, books, and miscellaneous personal expenses.

Payments: Payments for the KSU Study Abroad program fees should be made to the Office of International Programs, Study Abroad Program, 304 Fairchild Hall. K-State tuition and DCE fee will be billed to student iSIS accounts.
