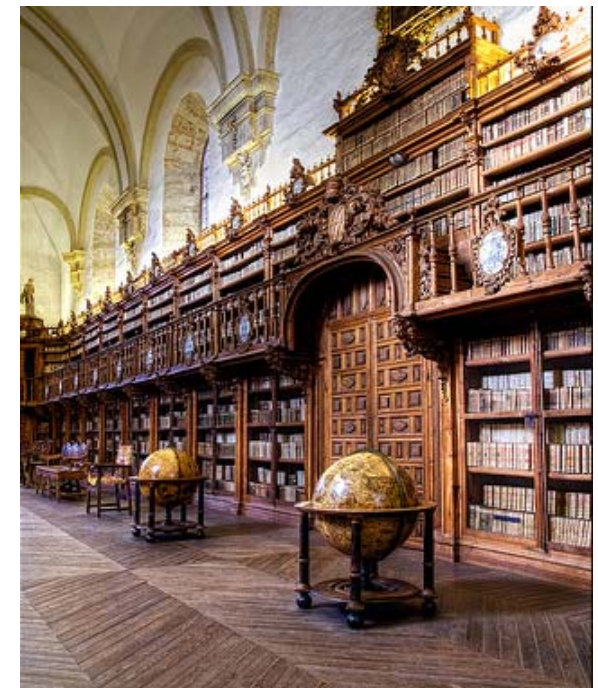

Study Abroad Program

PROGRAM

This program provides a five week experience of immersion into the life of modern Spain.

Class will take place at the Dept. of International Courses of the Universidad de Salamanca, and field activities will include visits to other artistic and historically prominent cities (Granada, Córdoba, Sevilla, Mérida, Salamanca, Toledo, El Escorial, Avila, Segovia, Leon, Santiago de Compostela).

An initial three day and a final six day tour of cities and cultural activities will provide an intensive direct involvement in communicative situations for language acquisition and on-site learning about the diversity that makes up the rich multi-cultural Spanish legacy.

Salamanca is famous for its university, the oldest in the Spanish speaking world and the third oldest in Europe (chartered in 1218). The city has a population of 355,000, located two hours from the Portuguese border in the Castile region, birthplace of the Spanish language, and is well known for its history, art, intellectual and academic achievements.

FACULTY LEADER

Dr. Silvia Sauter, Professor of Spanish for Modern Languages Department joined Kansas State University in 1988. She has led the summer program in Mexico for five summers, has studied in and traveled through Spain since 1975. Dr. Sauter has published on 19th & 20th century Spanish-American and Spanish literature and culture.

CREDIT

Students will earn 9 hours of undergraduate credit for SPAN 565 or 569. Six credits from Universidad de Salamanca and three from K-State. Six UGE credits possible through this program.

ELIGIBILITY

Students should have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and instructor permission or have taken Spanish 4. Students also need a passport and the International Student Card. No visa required for up to 3 months. Permission to enter Spain is also valid for all countries within the European Union.

COMPONENTS

- Preliminary meetings and lectures at K-State
- 40 Hours of Language classes in Salamanca
- 40 hours of optional subjects (Literature, culture, history, writing, conversation, art history, or Spanish for business)
- Course on Spanish cinema
- Additional hours– extra activities
- Cultural tour of three days during the first week and four days during the final week
- Campus fees at Universidad de Salamanca cover libraries, language and computer labs, gym and sports fields
- On site classes and visits

COST

Program Fees: Approximately \$4,989 (includes international airfare from Chicago to Madrid, accommodations, in-country transportation, admission to cultural sites, group meals, study abroad fee, and international medical insurance). **Final Cost To Be Announced once program is officially approved by OIP.**

Tuition and Fees: Tuition and fees for one 3-credit hour K-State undergraduate course. Division of Continuing Education Fee: \$21.50.

Anticipated Additional Expenses: Individual meals, books and personal expenses.
