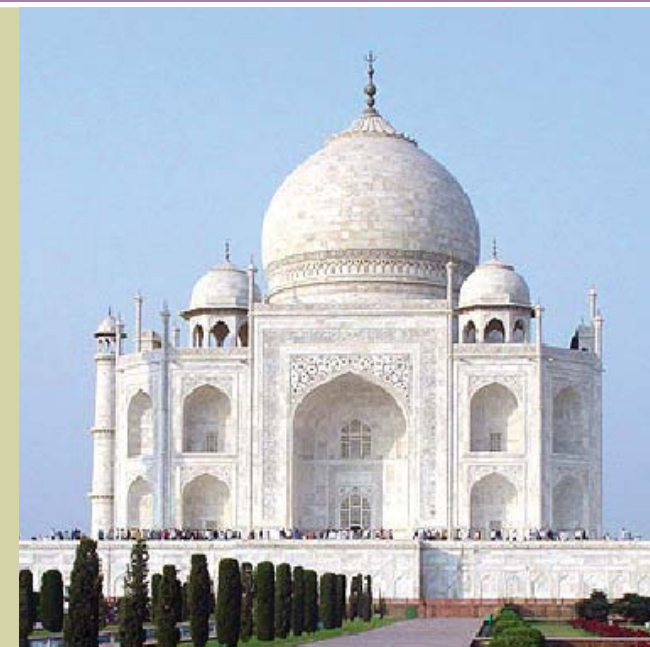

Agriculture and Food Processing



PROGRAM

This study tour is focused on providing students an opportunity to experience traditional and modern agricultural practices, food processing industry, university life, and culture of India. Students will tour historical sites in Delhi and visit the Taj Mahal in Agra. There will also be visits to two large agricultural universities where students will be exposed to educational and research systems and have the opportunity to interact with Indian college students.

FACULTY LEADER

Dr. Sajid Alavi teaches courses and conducts researched focused on extrusion processing, the technology used to make a variety of foods, such as cheese puffs, pasta, breakfast cereals and pet foods. Dr. Alavi is very active in international activities like short courses, industry training and collaborative research, especially in relation to South Asia, South America, Middle East and Africa.

Dr. Hulya Dogan teaches courses and conducts research in grain processing and milling, biopolymer science, food rheology, food processing, mathematical modeling, and process optimization. Dr. Dogan has been involved in various international activities and collaborative research with multiple countries including Turkey and China.

Dr. Bhadriraju Subramanyam teaches courses and conducts research focused on the areas of

food safety, plant sanitation and stored products entomology. Dr. Subramanyam is an internationally recognized scientist. He has extensive international experience and conducts short courses, workshops and collaborative research projects in various countries across the world including India, China, Greece, Egypt, United Arab Emirates and South East Asia.

CREDIT

Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive 3 undergraduate or 3 graduate credits for GRSC 790.

ELIGIBILITY

Minimum 2.5 GPA and instructor permission required.

COST

Program Fees: \$3,091 (*includes international airfare, accommodations, in-country transportation, K-State study abroad administrative fee, group meals, program provider fees, contingency fees, some groceries, and international health insurance*)

Anticipated Additional Expenses: \$545 (*for expenses such as passport fee, student visa, individual meals, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, textbooks, immunizations, and phone charges*)

Estimated K-State Tuition and Fees: \$618.40 for 3 undergraduate credit hours or \$839.70 for 3 graduate credit hours. \$21.50 Division of Continuing Education Fee
