K-State in Leipzig
Special Studies in German



PROGRAM

This summer course includes both intensive language instruction at the Universitat Leipzig's Herder Institut and a two-week, faculty-led tour of cities and sights in "the new Federal States," during which students will visit, experience, talk, and write about important German cultural sites. Prior to the language course in Leipzig, students will spend a week with a K-State professor in Berlin and Potsdam, observing and reflecting on the traces three political systems in a century have left on Germany's largest city.

Travel Dates: June 1 – July 9, 2010

FACULTY LEADER

Dr. Jennifer Askey received her PhD in Germanic Languages and Literatures from Washington University and has taught at K-State since Fall 2005. Dr. Askey teaches German language at all levels at K-State, specializing in literature of the late nineteenth century (Naturalism, Realism) and in contemporary German writing by Jewish authors. Dr. Askey has previously taken K-State students to Leipzig on this program, in 2008. In addition to the language immersion aspects of study abroad experience, Dr. Askey enjoys the opportunity to experience living history with students.

CREDIT

Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive 3 K-State undergraduate credits for GRMN 529 and 4-5 Herder Insitut transfer credits for language study.

ELIGIBILITY

2.5 Minimum GPA. Previous study of German is helpful, but not required.

COST

Program Fees: \$3,307 (includes: in-country transportation, accommodations, tuition/fees at the Herder Institut, group meals, K-State study abroad administrative fee, Herder Institut excursion week, and international health insurance).

Anticipated Additional Expenses: Approximately \$2,695 (for fees such as passport, individual meals, international airfare, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, spending money, and phone charges).

Estimated K-State Tuition and Fees: \$618.60 for 3 undergraduate credit hours and \$21.50 Division of Continuing Education Fee
