Scotland Studio Art Workshop



PROGRAM

The Scotland Studio Art Workshop is a study abroad course based in Edinburgh with course-related excursions to the Highlands and the Isle of Skye. Edinburgh is a vibrant medieval city with rich cultural traditions and a wealth of art historical and contemporary influences. While in Edinburgh students will explore the long tradition of art and architecture as the main focus, while also highlighting Edinburgh's tradition of literature and philosophy.

FACULTY LEADER

Kevin Bernstein is a painter and printmaker. He is currently Assistant Professor of Art and Area Coordinator of 2D Foundations and serves as Graduate Painting Faculty in the Department of Art at Kansas State University. He has exhibited his work in the United States, Italy, and the United Kingdom. His travels abroad have included Morocco, Spain, Greece, Switzerland, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, England, and France.

CREDIT

Upon successful completion of the course, three hours of K-State undergraduate or graduate credit will be awarded for ART 630A.

ELIGIBILITY

Minimum 3.0 GPA

25 completed K-State credit hours

1 art course preferred OR instructor permission

- Visit the Eilean Donan Castle and Lochness
- Tour the Glasgow Museum of Modern Art, the Glasgow School of Art, and the Contemporary Museum of Art
- Visit St. Andrews cathedral and castle
- Explore the Isle of Skye
- Visit the National Gallery of Scotland, the Scottish National Portrait Gallery, the Royal Museum, and the Museum of Scotland



COST

Program Fees: \$3,508 (includes international airfare, accommodations, K-State study abroad administrative fee, contingency fee, some art supplies, Highland/Isle of Skye 3-day tour, and international health insurance)

Anticipated Additional Expenses: Approximately \$1,860 (for expenses such as passport fee, meals, gratuities/tips, phone charges, in-country transportation, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, events/tours, course supplies, and textbook.

Estimated K-State Tuition and Fees: \$618.60 for 3 undergraduate credit hours and \$21.50 Division of Continuing Education Fee
