Agriculture Study Tour



PROGRAM

In this Animal Science study tour to South Africa, students will be introduced to livestock and crop production and management practices, along with other historical and cultural education opportunities. Students will tour cattle, sheep, poultry, and wild game farms. Preparatory class meetings will take place during the Spring 2010 semester to familiarize students with the geography and locations that will be visited.

FACULTY LEADER

Grieger has co-led an agricultural tour of Costa Rica in 2007. He has also conducted some teaching and research projects in embryo transfer in Costa Rica. In addition, he has traveled to China to consult on a beef cattle development project.

Students will be awarded 3 K-State undergraduate or graduate credits for ASI 660 upon successful completion of the course.
