Law, Politics, and Literature



PROGRAM

The Law, Politics and Literature in London study tour will be co-sponsored by the Political Science Department, the English Department, and the College of Arts & Sciences at K-State University. The purpose of the program is to introduce students to the interdisciplinary connections between British and American culture through the study of law, politics, and literature. Students are required to enroll in two courses for undergraduate or graduate credit: POLSC 670 "Law, Politics, and Literature in London" and ENGL 450 "Shakespeare's London."

FACULTY LEADERS

Dr. Don Hedrick is a Professor of English at Kansas State University and an internationally recognized Shakespeare scholar. He has published widely in Shakespeare and Renaissance drama, architectural history, film, and cultural theory. He has led several study abroad tours and has held a Senior Teaching Fulbright Fellowship at Charles University in Prague.

Dr. John Fliter is an Associate Professor of Political Science at K-State University. His research interests include the Supreme Court, judicial policy making, civil liberties, criminal justice, law, politics, and literature. Dr. Fliter is a recipient of the Stamey Teaching Award and has been nominated for various teaching and advising awards.

Daralyn Gordon Arata, Esquire is the Pre-Law Advisor at K-State University. Mrs. Arata holds a Juris Doctorate from the Marshall-Wythe School of Law of the College of William and Mary and a LL.M. in Taxation from George Washington University. She has numerous years of experience in the practice of law. She has traveled extensively, including frequent visits to the United Kingdom.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Students will have two planning/academic meetings before and one after the study tour, with selected readings in literature, legal thinking, history, and Shakespeare. They will prepare a short, individual research project on a specific site on the tour; guide our one-hour daily discussions; keep an on-site journal directed toward the required course activities, tours, plays, and discussions; and write a concluding paper after the trip. Arrangements will be made for off-campus participants.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Tour the Royal Courts of Justice
- Explore the Law School of Queen Mary University of London
- Participate in a walking tour of the Inns of Court
- Visit the Tower of London, and the Speaker's Corner in Hyde Park
- Visit areas currently and historically associated with the London legal and punishment system
- Attend several plays at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, the National Theatre, and others
- Participate in the audience of a BBC political show broadcast
- Visit the Churchill Museum and War Rooms
- Explore the British Museum, including the Elgin Marbles
- Spend a day in Oxford

COST

Program Fees: \$3,996 (*includes international airfare, accommodation, in-country transportation, Kansas State study abroad administrative fee, events/tours, and international health insurance*)

Anticipated Additional Expenses: Approximately \$600 (*for expenses such as passport fee, meals, optional tours, and transportation to/from U.S. point of departure*) A housing damage deposit of \$500 is refundable after the trip.

Estimated K-State Tuition and Fees: \$1,237.20 for six K-State undergraduate credits or \$1,679.40 for six K-State graduate credits. \$43 Division of Continuing Education Fee for two classes.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR PROGRAM FEES

- \$1,000 due with application by March 1, 2010
- \$1,500 due March 12, 2010
- \$1,469 due March 26, 2010

Program fees are collected by the Study Abroad Program Office, 304 Fairchild Hall. K-State tuition/fees and DCE fee will be billed to student ISIS accounts.

CREDIT

Upon successful completion of the courses, students will be awarded six K-State undergraduate or graduate credits in POLSC 670 and ENGL 450.

ELIGIBILITY

Minimum 2.5 GPA
