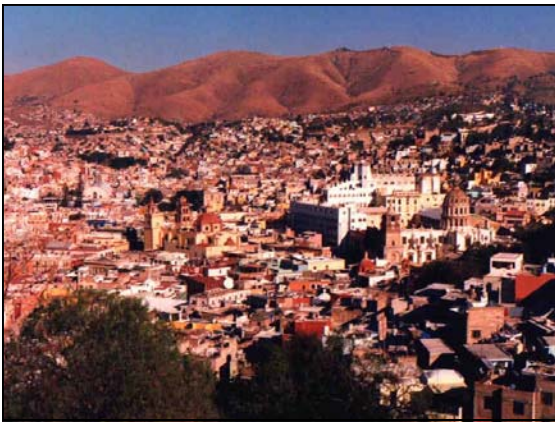

PROGRAM

This program, sponsored by the Department of Modern Languages, provides six weeks of language and cultural immersion in Querétaro, Mexico, for all levels of students in Spanish. Nine hours of credits are available, including six hours from Tecnológico of Monterrey, and three hours from Kansas State University. Students take these classes at the Monterrey Tec, Querétaro campus. Located in central Mexico, just 150 miles from Mexico City.

FACULTY LEADER

Dr. María Teresa Martínez-Ortiz holds a Ph.D. in Latin American Literature and Culture and Latino/a Studies from Purdue University. She has taught a number of Spanish language and culture classes at K-State.

ELIGIBILITY

2.5 Minimum GPA and instructor permission

CREDIT

Nine undergraduate credits are available (six transfer credit hours from Tecnológico of Monterrey and three hours from K-State). Credits will be awarded upon successful completion of the courses.

COST

Program Fees: \$4,666 (includes international airfare, accommodations with host family, three meals per day, laundry, in-country transportation, K-State study abroad administration fee, tuition/fees at ITESM in Mexico, contingency fee, excursions/tours, and international medical insurance).

Estimated K-State Tuition and Fees: \$618.60 for 3 credits of K-State undergraduate tuition and \$21.50 Division of Continuing Education Fee.

Anticipated Additional Expenses: \$500 (for fees such as passport fee, additional meals, textbooks, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, gratuities/tips, additional in-country transportation).
