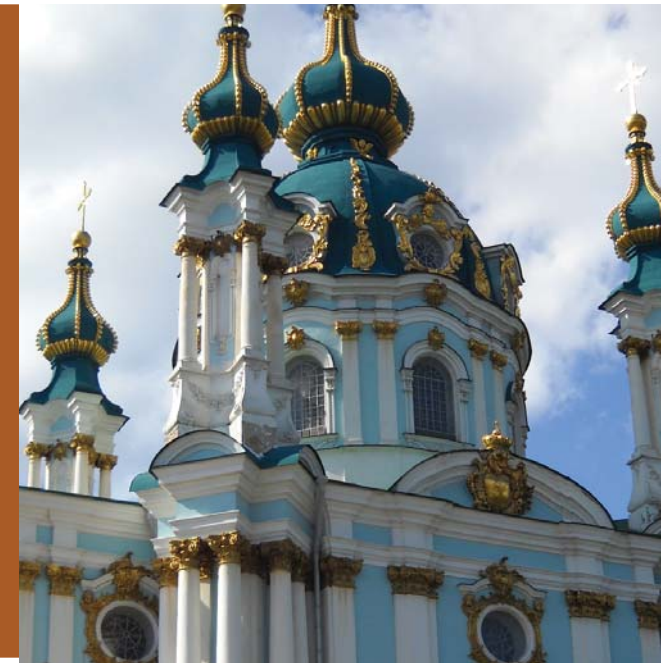

## PROGRAM

The study tour will explore three different countries: Hungary, Ukraine, and Russia to give a diverse view of the region. In each country, students will participate in various activities facilitating the understanding of the scope and peculiarities of transformation. During the trip, we will: (1) travel on the train across Eastern Europe; (2) visit historic sites (e.g., the Red Square in Moscow) and social institutions (e.g., the Parliament of Hungary); (3) participate in a student conference at Kyiv State University and learn about lives of Ukrainian students; (4) take part in a photo contest documenting the post-communist change; (5) explore cultural events and venues in all three countries.

## FACULTY LEADERS

Dr. Nadia Shapkina is a national of the Russian Federation. She holds a bachelor's degree in Social Work, a master's degree in Sociology, and a Ph.D. in Sociology of Gender and Sexuality. Her current research examines patterns of gendered migration. At Kansas State University, she teaches courses on sociological theory; sociology of women; race and ethnic relations, human trafficking, and gender, power, and development.

Dr. Laszlo Kulcsar is a national of Hungary. His field of expertise is social demography and regional development, with a particular emphasis on migration and spatial inequalities. He researches the social and demographic transformation of

Eastern Europe from a historical perspective, with a particular emphasis on the post-socialist period. Dr. Kulcsar teaches courses on social and spatial inequalities, population dynamics, aging, immigration and sociological methodology.

## CREDIT

Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive 3 hours of undergraduate or graduate credit in SOCIO 500 or SOCIO 701.

## ELIGIBILITY

Minimum 2.5 GPA and instructor permission required.

## COST

Program Fees: \$4,441 (includes: international airfare, accommodations, in-country transportation, K-State study abroad administration fee, group meals, multiple tours, contingency fee, and international health insurance)

Anticipated Additional Expenses: \$984 (for expenses such as passport fee, student visa, individual meals, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, gratuities/tips, and phone charges).

Estimated K-State Tuition and Fees: \$618.60 for 3 undergraduate credit hours or \$839.70 for 3 graduate credit hours. \$21.50 Division of Continuing Education Fee.
