\$1,000 due with application on February 8, 2010. Late applications may be reviewed until program is full.

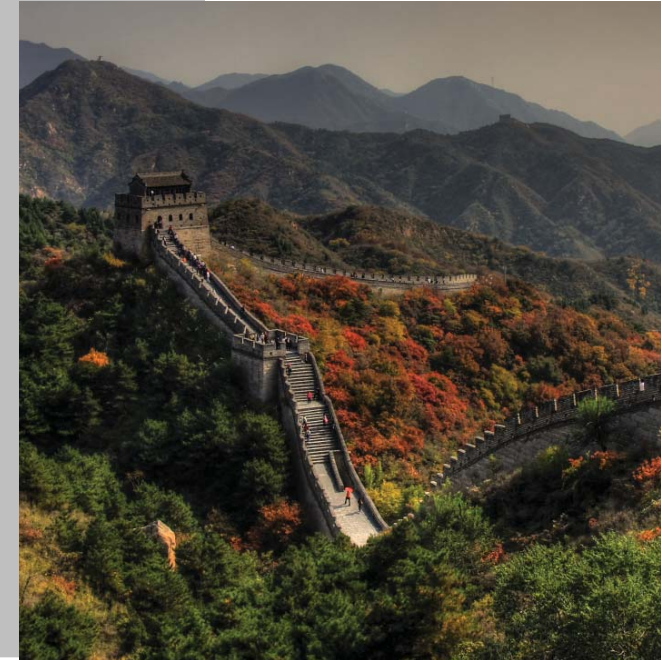

Beijing, China
ENCOUNTER CHINESE CULTURE



PROGRAM

This course will be held over a 3 week period during the summer. Students will meet on the K-State Manhattan campus for 1 week to read and discuss Chinese culture. Students will then spend 2 weeks in Beijing, China participating in cultural activities and lectures and visiting various landmarks

Course Dates: May 24 - June 30, 2010

FACULTY LEADER

Dr. Han Yu is an assistant professor in the English Department at Kansas State University. A native Chinese, Dr. Yu is fluent in the Chinese language and familiar with the Chinese culture. Since joining Kansas State University in Fall 2007, she has taught undergraduate and graduate level business/technical/professional writing and communication courses, including an international/cross-cultural professional communication course. Dr. Yu's research interests are on professional communication, writing assessment, and international/cross-cultural communication.

CREDIT

Three hours of undergraduate credit for ENGL 395: Topics in English or three hours of graduate credit for ENGL 685: Special Topics in Rhetoric and Composition will be granted by Kansas State University upon successful completion of the course.

ELIGIBILITY

Minimum 2.5 GPA

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Students will read/view, analyze, and reflect on materials concerning Chinese culture. Students will experience Chinese culture first-hand. Students will have the opportunity to interact with Chinese college students. Students will complete several writing assignments.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Visit The Forbidden City, Tian'anmen Square, the Great Wall, and more
- Visit the Beijing Olympic National Stadium
- Participate in local cultural events such as the Chinese acrobatic show, the Tai Chi lessons, and more.



COST

Program Fees collected by the Office of International Programs: \$3,539.00 (includes international airfare, accommodations, in-country transportation, tours/admissions, contingency fee, group meals, K-State study abroad administrative fee, program provider fees, and international health insurance).

Anticipated Additional Expenses: \$555.00 (for expenses such as passport fee, individual meals, student visa, and textbooks/course supplies.)

Estimated K-State Tuition and Fees \$618.60 for three undergraduate credits and \$839.70 for three graduate credits. \$21.50 for the Division of Continuing Education Fee.
