Out-of-state students pay in-state tuition

Blaise-Pascal University, Vichy, France ♦

The city of Vichy is in the Auvergne region of France, known for its national parks and its small villages with castles dating back to medieval times. Many leisure and cultural activities are available, and Vichy is ideally situated for travel to the south of France, Paris, and other European countries. In the Spring semester, students can take 12 credits of intensive French through the SUEE program (http://www.univ-bpclermont.fr/suee/SUEE_en.htm). Many K-Staters have participated in the International Business Program, which is designed for students with little or no background in French. Students will take one class in the French language, but the remainder of classes will be taught in English. Marketing in Europe and International Trade are two of courses offered in this program. Students who spend two semesters here will earn the Blaise Pascal University Degree in International Business with French. Students will pay tuition and fees to Kansas State.

Focus your studies on sustainable energy in Austria, Belgium or France! The FIPSE program provides opportunities for juniors, seniors and graduate students to complete coursework and/or research and broadens the field of study from food to non-food agricultural materials and applications. European partners include Ghent University, Belgium; Karl Franzens University, Graz, Austria; and National Polytechnic Institute of Toulouse, France. *Most courses will be taught in English at each of the three European universities.* The University of Graz (Austria) offers some courses in German. The National Polytechnic Institute of Toulouse (France) offers some courses in French.

Institut National Polytechnique de Lorraine, Nancy, France*

Study at one of the best agricultural universities in France. During the school year, classes are offered in agronomy, food science, and milling science. Intensive French is offered before classes begin; however, some previous French is necessary. Students will pay tuition and fees to Kansas State.

International Student Exchange Program (ISEP)*

Through ISEP, K-State students can study at over a dozen universities in France while paying tuition, fees, room and board to K-State. At most universities on the ISEP exchange, students integrate into a French university and take classes in French with French students. At least four semesters of college French are required for exchange to those universities. A few universities on the ISEP exchange program offer intensive French programs, and students at intermediate level French may apply to these for full-time language study. ISEP programs have early deadlines, so begin research early.

Mid-America Universities International (MAUI)*

Through KSU's membership in an organization called MAUI (Mid-America Universities International), students have the opportunity to pay tuition and fees to K-State and housing and board to one of four universities in France. Attend the Université des Sciences et Technologies de Lille or one of three universities located in Strasbourg. These universities offer classes in business, engineering, agriculture, and nearly any subject in the College of Arts & Sciences. All classes will be in French, so proficiency in French is needed.

Purpan School of Agriculture, Toulouse, France ♦

No knowledge of French is necessary to participate in this summer program in a beautiful area of France, the largest agricultural producer in Europe. In the on-campus program in June, students take classes in English on topics including European animal production and crop production & food processing. Students will also take intensive French courses. In July, students may participate in a four-week internship program in animal production, agro-tourism, plant production, or vineyards/wineries. This program includes many cultural excursions and outings to agricultural production sites. Students pay tuition and fees to Kansas State. Students with strong French language skills can spend a semester at this university.

Grenoble is a lively city (population 400,000) full of college students and situated in the French Alps. Students can enjoy the natural beauty and outdoor activities of the area, but can easily take trains or planes to other areas of France and Europe. This program is for students who have completed at least three semesters of college French. In addition to classes in the French language, students choose from classes on French Art, Cinema, Politics, History, Literature, and other subjects. Most students live with a host family, although student residence halls are also available. API also offers programs in Paris, including one that allows advanced students to study at a French university with French students.

Spend a semester studying the French language in the French Alps. IFALPES is a leading French language training institute that attracts students learning French from all over the world. The city of Annecy is located on a stunning alpine lake and canals run through the picturesque town center. At the Institute for American Universities in Aix-en-Provence you can study French but also take a number of classes in a wide range of disciplines in English. Aix is a lovely town of 130,000 people near the Mediterranean Coast. It is known for its leafy streets, fountains, and large student population.
