K-State is a member of ISEP, an international exchange program that allows students to study at universities all over the world while paying tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State. Students can choose placement in the Japanese cities Nagoya and Tokyo. ISEP deadlines are earlier than those of most other programs.

Chukyo University is in Nagoya and is an immersion for students with one year of Japanese language.

Nanzan University is in Nagoya and offers classes in both Japanese and English.

Toyo University is located in central Tokyo and is for students with at least one year of Japanese language.

Hirakata City is in a great geographic location, about half an hour from both Osaka and Kyoto. At Kansai Gaidai the Asian Studies Program is twofold: the rigorous Japanese language studies and also courses in English in the Social Sciences, Humanities, and Business/Economics pertinent to Japan and Asia. These courses make it possible for participants to approach a wide array of study areas during their stay in Japan. This is an exciting opportunity for students of all majors.
