The FIPSE program provides opportunities for seniors and graduate students to complete coursework and/or research and broadens the field of study from food to non-food agricultural materials and applications. European partners include Ghent University, Belgium; Karl Franzens University, Graz, Austria; and National Polytechnic Institute of Toulouse, France. Most courses will be taught in English at each of the three European universities. The University of Graz (Austria) does offer their courses in German and the National Polytechnic Institute of Toulouse (France) will teach some of their courses in English and some in French.

Purpan School of Agriculture, Toulouse, France

No knowledge of French is necessary to participate in this summer program in a beautiful area of France, the largest agricultural producer in Europe. In the on-campus program in June, students take classes in English on topics including European animal production and crop production and food processing. Students will also take intensive French courses. In July, students may participate in a four-week internship program in animal production, agro-tourism, plant production, or vineyards/wineries. The program includes many cultural excursions and outings to agricultural production sites. Students pay tuition and fees to Kansas State. Students with strong French language skills can spend a semester at this university.

University of Blaise Pascal in Vichy, France

Vichy, pop. 26,500, is about 30 minutes from Clermont-Ferrand and is known for its national parks and its small villages with medieval castles. This program is designed for students with little or no background in French, the International Business program is conducted in English at the Vichy campus of the University.

University of Life Sciences in Prague, Czech Republic

Spend a summer in the magical city of Prague. This gorgeous city is filled with castles, cathedrals and towers, but is also a lively, modern city, full of energy. Its central location in Europe also makes it ideal for travel. Classes at "Czech Ag" are taught in English in ag economics and management, natural resources and environment, forestry, water and landscape management, and environmental engineering. A special 4 week summer program is available, offering classes in agricultural economics, rural sociology, and Czech language and culture. This program includes many excursions to Czech farms, including a 5 day study tour and a weekend stay with a family. Students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to K- State.

This program is especially designed for upper-level students in business, journalism, and mass communications. The town of Paderno del Grappa is nestled in the foothills of the Dolomite mountains, in the Veneto region. The location of the campus offers the cultural experience of living in a small Italian community while providing direct access to the well-known art and history treasures of the Veneto, which contains the major cities of Venice, Padua, Vicenza and Verona. Travel time -- two week-long breaks and three long weekends -- is built into the program so students can explore Europe on their own. Convenient rail connections from Venice allow weekend visits to locations in Italy, France, Germany, Switzerland, and many other countries. A full range of business and economics core courses and electives, as well as required and elective courses in journalism and communication studies, are taught in English, and Italian language classes are offered as well.

The Maastricht Center gathers students and faculty from 30 universities around the world to study issues with a multidisciplinary approach. During the summer session, which runs from early June until early July, students have four courses to choose from, two in business and two in the humanities and social sciences; students usually take one class, but may take two. Maastricht is a charming city of 120,000. Located near the Belgian and German borders, it is located in an ideal spot for traveling, and the fact that there are no classes on Friday's makes traveling very easy! This is one of the cheapest options for studying in Europe during the summer.
