Kansai Gaidai University, Hirakata, Japan

Beginning in Fall 2006, K-State will have an exchange with Kansai Gaidai University. Students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State when they attend this wonderful university in Japan. Located between Kyoto and Osaka, many classes make use of the region's historical and cultural sites through field trips. No Japanese is necessary for the Asian Studies Program, which offers classes in history, politics, anthropology, sociology, literature, cinema, business and other fields. Art majors can take art history classes, as well as studio art classes in ceramic techniques and Japanese brush painting (*Sumi-e*). Spaces are limited and fill early – contact your study abroad advisor.

Kyung Hee University, South Korea

This large, multi-campus university has much to offer at its College of Fine Arts! Students can choose to study Korean painting, classic painting, and sculpture. Since the school's policy aims to promote the creation of a rich cultural community, great importance is placed on the research of the various aspects of modern art and culture on a global scale along with the identity of Korean art. The Seoul campus also offers a program in Art & Design. Newly renovated student dorms provide internet access, and are close to campus, dining halls, and restaurants.

West Wales School of the Arts, Carmarthen, Wales

Study abroad off the beaten path with a semester in Wales. Located 200 miles west of London and 200 miles southeast of Dublin, you will find the small town of Carmarthen. Living in this city of roughly 12,000, you are sure to get a sense of Welsh culture. Students will also get to compare the difference of a large US university to a small specialized school. West Wales offers courses in 2D and 3D arts and allows students to choose among classes from both fields including print, drawing, painting and sculpture while paying K-State tuition. As there aren't any dormitories in Carmarthen, students typically stay in shared houses in town. No previous knowledge of Welsh is necessary!
