Deakin University, Geelong and Warnambool, Australia

Deakin is one of Australia's largest universities and attracts students from all over the world. Students are welcomed with a three-day orientation that includes surfing on the beach or hiking in the mountains before they are transported to the Geelong or Warnambool campus, which both offer programs in journalism. Deakin's journalism and public relations courses are designed to prepare students for the real world and include an intensive practical component, ensuring strong job-entry skills. Since Deakin is a world leader in the development of internships for its students and has especially strong ties in the communications industry, students may want to do an internship for academic credit.

University of Hertfordshire, Hatfield, England

An hour from London, the University of Hertfordshire gives you the best of both worlds: you'll live in an active university town with pubs, cinemas and shopping centers, but have easy access to the bustle and nightlife of London. Students will pay tuition and fees and K-State and housing costs to the host university. Students can study journalism, including digital publishing, as well as other subjects. This exchange is best for a full-year or spring semester, since fall term runs until late January.

Consortium of Universities for International Studies in Paderno del Grappa, Italy

This program is especially designed for upper-level students in business, journalism, and mass communications. The town of Paderno del Grappa is nestled in the foothills of the Dolomite mountains, in the Veneto region. The location of the campus offers the cultural experience of living in a small Italian community while providing direct access to the well-known art and history treasures of the Veneto, which contains the major cities of Venice, Padua, Vicenza and Verona. Travel time -- two week-long breaks and three long weekends -- is built into the program so students can explore Europe on their own. Convenient rail connections from Venice allow weekend visits to locations in Italy, France, Germany, Switzerland, and many other countries. A full range of business and economics core courses and electives, as well as required and elective courses in journalism and communication studies, are taught in English, and Italian language classes are offered as well.

Also in Sydney are internships in PR and advertising at the Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children or for an organization helping young people with cancer. Journalists can also intern with a major television station in Newcastle. At the University of Tasmania, you can combine a journalism internship with classwork.
