#### **Czech University of Agriculture, Prague, Czech Republic**

Spend a semester or a summer in the magical city of Prague. This gorgeous city is filled with castles, cathedrals and towers, but is also a lively, modern city, full of energy. Its central location in Europe also makes it ideal for travel. Classes at "Czech Ag" are taught in English in ag economics and management, natural resources and environment, forestry, water and landscape management, and environmental engineering. A special four-week summer program is also available, offering classes in agricultural economics, rural sociology, and Czech language and culture. This program includes many excursions to Czech farms, including a five-day study tour and a weekend stay with a family. Students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to K- State.

#### **Purpan School of Agriculture, Toulouse, France**

No knowledge of French is necessary to participate in this summer program in a beautiful area of France, the largest agricultural producer in Europe. In the on-campus program in June, students take classes in English on topics including European animal production and crop production and food processing. Students will also take intensive French courses. In July, students may participate in a four-week internship program in animal production, agro-tourism, plant production, or vineyards/wineries. The program includes many cultural excursions and outings to agricultural production sites. Students pay tuition and fees to Kansas State. Students with strong French language skills can spend a semester at this university.

#### **Instituto Tecnológico de Estudios Superiores de Monterrey (ITESM), Mexico**

Study agriculture at the Monterrey or Queretaro campuses at this renowned private university. Queretaro is a charming, clean and safe city with restored old building and city squares. It is in the heart of Mexico, so students can travel easily. Monterrey is an important business center and a great place for internships. Students have the opportunity to volunteer in local communities if they wish, and most students take advantage of living with a Mexican host family, cultural excursions, and intramural sports. Students can study Spanish language at any level, from no previous Spanish to near fluency, and many classes in English in the social sciences and business are offered as well. Students with strong Spanish skills can study agribusiness, agriculture and cattle development, food technology and agricultural engineering. Students pay tuition and fees to Kansas State.

#### **Instituto Tecnológico de Costa Rica—Cartago and San Carlos, Costa Rica**

Both campuses have many great agriculture options for students with advanced Spanish skills. Enjoy the stunning beauty and temperate climate of this country while you study agronomy, animal science, production economics, forestry, and other areas of agriculture.

## **Institut National Polytechnique de Lorraine, Nancy, France**

Study at one of the best agricultural universities in France. During the school year, classes are offered in agronomy, food science, and milling science. Intensive French is offered before classes begin; however, some previous French is suggested. Students will pay tuition and fees to Kansas State.

## **Justus Leibig University, Giessen, Germany**

This is Germany's foremost agricultural university, and K-State students will find every class they need. All classes are taught in German and students must have completed three semesters of German in order to apply. A month-long preparatory class prior to the beginning of the semester will help strengthen students' German skills. Special scholarships administered through the German department are available.

## **University College Cork, Cork, Ireland**

The beautiful campus of University College Cork is centered around a quadrangle of stone buildings and is located upon a riverside close to the city center. Students can study just about anything, from accounting to zoology. The Department of Food Science and Technology teaches engineering, economics, marketing and management classes related to the food industry. Through K-State's membership in the MAUI consortium, students will pay tuition and fees to KSU and housing and board to the host university.

### **Australearn programs in Australia and New Zealand**

Spend a semester in Australia or New Zealand through Australearn. Many Australian and New Zealand universities offer programs in agriculture, and Australearn can facilitate your enrollment at one of these universities. You'll begin your program with an orientation, which will include an outdoor activity such as snorkeling on the Great Barrier Reef, and you'll have the chance spend a weekend volunteering on a wildlife conservation project. In Australia, Monash University, Southern Cross University, the University of Adelaide and the University of Queensland all offer agribusiness, as does Massey University in New Zealand. The University of Queensland and the University of Tasmania offer Agronomy. Other subjects frequently taught include Agricultural and Resource Economics, Food Science, Forestry, Horticultural Management, and Winemaking. Australian and New Zealand universities are particularly good in animal science and zoology. Australearn also offers an internship at the Cairns tropical zoo, where interns gain experience in all aspects of animal care and maintenance including animal feeding, food preparation, grooming, and animal record keeping.

### **API at The University of Limerick, Limerick, Ireland**

Through Academic Programs International, students can enroll at the University of Limerick. Limerick is situated on the River Shannon and is the third largest city in Ireland, with a population of 85,000. The University of Limerick's Department of Life Sciences offers numerous classes in equine studies and in food technology, and those in ag economics can find many business and finance classes. Through IFSA, you'll be able to enroll at the University of Reading to study ag econ, agricultural sciences, food sciences, and zoology and wildlife sciences, among other subjects. Reading is a historic city with Victorian red-brick buildings but is also a modern, lively city with great shopping and nightlife. In addition, London is less than half an hour by train!
