Charles University, Prague, Czech Republic

Spend a semester in the magical city of Prague, one of the most popular destinations for K-Staters. This gorgeous city is filled with castles, cathedrals and towers, but is also a lively, modern city, full of energy. Its central location in Europe also makes it ideal for travel. Charles University, the oldest university in Central Europe, is at the center of the bustling city. The East and Central European Studies program is a semester-long program designed for international students and offers classes in English in political science, history, music, art, psychology, English literature, sociology, and other areas. Students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State.

University of Hertfordshire, Hertsfield, England

An hour from London, the University of Hertfordshire gives you the best of both worlds: you'll live in an active university town with pubs, cinemas and shopping centers, but have easy access to the bustle and nightlife of London. Students will pay tuition and fees and K-State and housing costs to the host university. Take classes in biology, math, history, English, psychology and many other subjects. This exchange is best for a full-year or spring semester, since fall term runs until late January.

Kansai Gaidai University, Hirakata, Japan

Students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State when they attend this wonderful university in Japan. Located between Kyoto and Osaka, many classes make use of the region's historical and cultural sites through field trips. No Japanese is necessary for the Asian Studies Program, which offers classes in history, art, politics, anthropology, sociology, literature, cinema, business and other fields. Those needing literature credits, for example, may want to take "Geisha, Gangsters and Samurai: Images of Japan in Eastern Film and Literature," while those seeking social science credits may choose "The Culture of Food and Eating in Japan" from among the numerous offerings. Spaces are limited and fill early – contact your study abroad advisor.

Bogazici University in Istanbul, Turkey

Istanbul is a beautiful city full of culture and history and has a warm Mediterranean climate. The city straddles Asia and Europe, making it a wonderful location for traveling. Bogazici University was founded in the 1860s by an American and has always been an English-speaking university. All classes for its 10,000 students are in English, and students can find classes in a very wide range of disciplines.

University College Maastricht, Maastricht, Netherlands

At University College Maastricht, a liberal arts college within the University of Maastricht, all classes are taught in English. There are many introductory and upper-level classes in the sciences, social sciences and humanities. Maastricht, like the rest of the Netherlands, is a beautiful mix of the old and the new. High-tech industries flourish in the same buildings 17th century Dutch painters like Rembrandt and Vermeer would have recognized. Maastricht is a city of 120,000 in the very southern tip of the Netherlands and is only a bike ride away from the German and Belgian borders. It is an excellent location for travel throughout Europe. Through K-State's membership in the ISEP program, students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to KSU.

Not to be confused with University College Maastricht! The Maastricht Center gathers students and faculty from 30 universities around the world to study issues with a multidisciplinary approach. The MCTS semester is composed of four intensive "blocks," each of which run three-and-a-half weeks long. Students choose one class each block. While classes change every semester, most of the course offerings are from the humanities and social sciences. Maastricht is a charming city of 120,000. Located near the Belgian and German borders, it is an ideal spot for traveling. K-State's membership as a part of this program makes this a good reasonably-priced option for Europe.
