Bogazici University in Istanbul, Turkey <http://www.boun.edu.tr/undergraduate/index.html>

Istanbul is a beautiful city full of culture, history and a warm Mediterranean climate. The city straddles Asia and Europe, making it a great location for education and travel. Bogazici was founded in the 1860s by an American and has always been an English-speaking university. It has about 10, 000 students and offers courses in everything from Arts and Science to Engineering and Business.

Spend a semester in the magical city of Prague, one of the most popular destinations for K-Staters. This breath-taking city is filled with castles, cathedrals and towers, but is also a lively, modern city, full of energy. Its central location in Europe makes it ideal for travel. Charles University is the oldest university in Central Europe and located in the city center. The East and Central European Studies program is a semester-long program designed for international students and offers classes in English in political science, history, music, art, psychology, English literature, sociology, and other areas.

Prague sits in the heart of central Europe. If you want to experience a more relaxed, less expensive Europe, this is the place to do it. CTU offers a lot of engineering in English. They offer Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Biomedical Engineering, as well as Transportation Sciences. CTU also has a buddy program that teams up K-State students with CTU students before you go.

Spend a semester or a summer in the magical city of Prague. This gorgeous city is filled with castles, cathedrals and towers, but is also a lively, modern city, full of energy. Its central location in Europe also makes it ideal for travel. Classes at "Czech Ag" are taught in English in ag economics and management, natural resources and environment, forestry, water and landscape management, and environmental engineering. A special four-week summer program is also available, offering classes in agricultural economics, rural sociology, and Czech language and culture. This program includes many excursions to Czech farms, including a five-day study tour and a weekend stay with a family.

Wroclaw is the largest city in south-western Poland with a population of nearly 800,000. Wroclaw is located about 170 miles north-east of Prague on the Odra River and is built on 12 islands linked that are linked by 112 bridges. The city has a rich history and with many famous cultural and academic events. Wroclaw University of Technology (WUT) is over 300 years old and is one of the top universities in Poland. WUT is home to over 30,000 students and has many technical courses in English for you to choose from. They have courses in areas like chemistry, electronics, computer science and many different varieties of engineering.
