ITESM has campuses in Mazatlan, Guadalajara, Toluca, Cuernavaca, Mexico City, Monterrey, San Luis Potosi, and Queretaro. *Fortune* magazine has touted Monterrey, Mexico as “the best place to do business in Latin America.” ITESM has many classes in English, as well as a wide offering of regular courses in Spanish and Spanish language for all levels. ISEP—International Student Exchange Program

Through ISEP, K-State students can study in Mexico, Chile, Argentina, Uruguay, Costa Rica, or Nicaragua while paying tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State. At most universities on the ISEP exchange, students integrate into a Spanish university and take classes in Spanish with local students. At least four semesters of college Spanish are required for exchange to those universities. A few universities on the ISEP exchange program offer intensive Spanish programs, and students at any level of Spanish may apply to those programs for full-time Spanish language study. ISEP deadlines are earlier than those of most other programs.
