Vaxjo University in Vaxjo, Sweden

Vaxjo, with 70,000 inhabitants, is 125 miles northwest of Copenhagen and 250 miles southwest of Stockholm. It is a charming city with forests, lakes, and fountains and a 700-year-old castle. Vaxjo University is known for its global approach to education and many programs are taught in English for both Swedish and international students. Education students can take classes on global and intercultural perspectives on education. This program consists of a mixture of school visits, lectures and discussions, and culminates with the design, implementation, and evaluation of a project carried out with teachers and pupils at local secondary schools. Students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to K-State.

ITESM at Campus Queretaro in Queretaro, Mexico

Because Queretaro (645,000) is located in the heart of Mexico, students studying here find it easy to travel from this centrally located spot. Queretaro, one of the cleanest and safest cities in Latin America, has a reputation as a modern industrial center. Students of all levels of Spanish can enroll in a wide variety of intensive language and Mexican culture and history classes. The campus of Queretaro enrolls 3,000 full-time students each year. This site is especially good for education majors who want to intern in a classroom in English or Spanish. Homestays or residence hall are available. Students will pay tuition and fees to K-State and housing costs to the host university.

ISEP programs in France

Through ISEP, students with intermediate French can study education and even do student teaching at the Université de Caen, the Université de Picardie and the Université de Lille. At the program in Caen, students may apply for paid English teaching positions at local French schools. Students will pay tuition, fees, room and board to K-State. ISEP programs have early deadlines, so begin research early!
