**Just because you don't speak a foreign language doesn't mean you're limited to studying in the United Kingdom, Ireland, Australia or New Zealand. Here are a few of the many programs where you can study in English in a location you may not have considered.**

## **K-State Exchanges** \*Out-of-state students pay in-state tuition!\*

### **Charles University, Prague, Czech Republic**

This wouldn't be one of Kansas State's most popular programs if students needed to know Czech to study there! Spend a semester in the magical city of Prague, a gorgeous city is filled with castles, cathedrals and towers, but also a lively, modern city, full of energy. Its central location in Europe also makes it ideal for travel. Charles University, the oldest university in Central Europe, is at the center of the bustling city. The East and Central European Studies program is a semester-long program designed for international students and offers classes in English in political science, history, music, art, psychology, English literature, sociology, and other areas. Students pay tuition, fees, room and board to K-State.

### **Kansai Gaidai University, Hirakata, Japan**

Located between Kyoto and Osaka, many classes make use of the region's historical and cultural sites through field trips. No Japanese is necessary for the Asian Studies Program, which offers classes in history, art, politics, anthropology, sociology, literature, cinema, business and other fields. ### **Bogazici University in Istanbul, Turkey**

Istanbul is a beautiful city full of culture and history and has a warm Mediterranean climate. The city straddles Asia and Europe, making it a wonderful location for traveling. Bogazici University was founded in the 1860s by an American and has always been an English-speaking university. All classes for its 10,000 students are in English, and students can find classes in a very wide range of disciplines.

### **Växjö University, Växjö, Sweden**

Vaxjo, with 70,000 inhabitants, is 125 miles northwest of Copenhagen and 250 miles southwest of Stockholm. It is a charming city with forests, lakes, and fountains and a 700-year-old castle. The university is known for its global approach to education and many programs are taught in English for both Swedish and international students. There are many classes in business, the sciences, social sciences, and humanities. Students pay tuition, fees, room and board to K-State.

### **ISEP Exchanges: Study in English All Over the World**

Through Kansas State's membership in the ISEP consortium, you'll pay tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State while studying in one of thirty-five countries around the world. Through KSU's membership in an organization called MAUI (Mid-America Universities International), students have the opportunity to pay tuition and fees to K-State and housing and board to a host university in Europe. ### **Maastricht Center for Transatlantic Studies, Maastricht, Netherlands**

The Maastricht Center gathers students and faculty from 30 universities around the world to study issues with a multidisciplinary approach. The MCTS semester is composed of four intensive "blocks," each of which run three-and-a-half weeks long. Students choose one class each block. While classes change every semester, most of the course offerings are from the humanities and social sciences. Maastricht is a charming city of 120,000. Located near the Belgian and German borders, it is located in an ideal spot for traveling. K-State's membership as a part of this program makes this a good reasonably-priced option for Europe.
