K-State Faculty-led Programs *Out-of-state students pay in-state tuition!*

Every summer, Kansas State faculty members lead students on study abroad programs in Europe. For language study, professors from the Department of Modern Languages lead programs in France, Germany and Spain. Faculty frequently offer three-week programs in Italy and Central Europe as well. Students should investigate and sign up for these programs in the fall and early spring.

ISEP offers summer language programs in France, Germany and Spain. Or, study animal and plant ecology in Finland or Korean language and culture at Ajou or Yonsei universities!

Justus Liebig University, Giessen, Germany

Through Kansas State's exchange program with this university near Frankfurt, students can participate in three summer programs. Economics and/or business students may choose between *Problems in a Global Economy* or *International Management. Commercializing Biotechnology in Europe's Legal Environment* is for anyone interested in starting a biotechnology firm.

Maastricht Center for Transatlantic Studies, Maastricht, Netherlands

The Maastricht Center gathers students and faculty from 30 universities around the world to study issues with a multidisciplinary approach. During the summer session, which runs from early June until early July, students have four courses to choose from, two in business and two in the humanities and social sciences; students usually take one class, but may take two. Maastricht is a charming city of 120,000. Located near the Belgian and German borders, it is located in an ideal spot for traveling, and the fact that there are no classes on Fridays makes traveling very easy! This is one of the cheapest options for studying in Europe during the summer.

Programs are also available in architecture and interior design, European culture & politics, and international business and economics.

This program is subsidized by the E.U. so the cost is low. A limited number of spots are available to American students whose universities are part of the MAUI network, which includes Kansas State. Highly motivated juniors and seniors may apply – the deadline in March 1st.
