### ***Study in German (JLU, LMU, ISEP) or English (Zeppelin)***

#### **Justus-Liebig University, Giessen**

This is one of K-State's longest standing exchange agreements. Classes are available in nearly all the subjects available at Kansas State, ranging from agriculture, to home economics, to nutrition, and Geology. Classes are in German, so students will need to at least an intermediate level of German. K-State students pay tuition, fee, room and board to KSU on this program. Special scholarships administered through the Department of Modern Languages can make this an extremely low-cost option. Giessen is a lively university town near Frankfurt.

#### **Ludwig Maximilians University, Munich**

Spend a semester in the city of Oktoberfest, the largest festival in the world. Munich is a beautiful, historic city with an active cultural scene. Travel around Munich and you'll find enchanting castles, sparkling lakes, and charming villages. LMU offers a very wide range of classes taught in German. K-State students pay tuition, fee, room and board to KSU. In the summer, LMU offers a special program in European Studies that takes place in Munich, Berlin and Prague. The summer program may include a German language option if desired.

#### **ISEP Programs in Germany, Austria and Switzerland**

K-State is a member of ISEP, an international exchange program that allows students to study at universities all over the world while paying tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State. Students can choose placement in the German cities of Bielefeld, Braunschweig, Dortmund, Eichstatt, and Trier; in Austrian universities in the cities of Linz, Graz or Salzburg; and at universities in Fribourg or Bern in Switzerland. ISEP deadlines are earlier than those of most other programs.

#### **Zeppelin University, Friedrichshafen, Germany**

Zeppelin University is nestled on the shores of Lake Constance, a large, freshwater lake which borders Switzerland, Austria, and Germany. The Alps are close by, as are countless vineyards. This recently-founded, private university specializes in management, economics, and communications. Nearly all professors speak English fluently, and many classes are offered in English. Students will pay tuition and fees to K-State.

#### **Schiller International University, Heidelberg, Germany**

Study in Heidelberg—a beautiful city filled with university students—an hour by train from Frankfurt and near scenic areas such as the Black Forest region and the Alps. Students may participate in the Intensive German Language Program, which is run in eight-week study cycles year-round. Or, they may choose the semester-long Business and Liberal Arts Program, which offers classes in English in business and the social sciences, in addition to German language.

## **Salzburg College, Salzburg, Austria**

Salzburg, a city of 140,000 people situated on the northern edge of the German border and surrounded by the Alps, is one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. Spend weekends hiking, skiing, or enjoying the rich cultural heritage of the city. The college is a small, private Austrian institution that offers many classes in the humanities, social sciences, and business.

#### **Phillips-Universität Marburg, International Undergraduate Study Program, Marburg, Germany**

This is a new program for students who would like to study German and take classes in English at the same time. In the first six weeks, students will study intensive German language and take a class on German history and culture. For the remainder of the semester, they'll take two classes in English in Political Science, economics and psychology. The program includes an interesting cultural program with many excursions.

### **Study in English**

#### **Fachhochschule Coburg and Fachhochschule Trier**

Classes in Interior Architecture are offered in English at both of these universities, each located in a small city with a population similar to Manhattan's. Coburg is a lovely town whose medieval, winding streets are filled with half-timbered houses and Art Nouveau buildings. Students may spend the weekends hiking in the nearby countryside or traveling to other cities in Europe. Trier is the oldest city in Germany – it still has Roman ruins! Very close to Luxembourg and France, Trier makes an excellent site for traveling if student tire of exploring the vineyards and rivers surrounding the city. Students will pay tuition and fees to Kansas State.

## ***Exchanges Especially for Business***

### **Study in English**

#### **European Viadrina University in Frankfurt (Oder), German**

Frankfurt (population 65,000) is located on the charming Oder River that separates Germany from Poland. It is about 60 miles away from Berlin, and is not to be confused with the other city of Frankfurt in Western Germany. Viadrina University is very international and offers courses in English that include Corporate Finance, Microeconomics and International Business Law. MBA students can also exchange here and take graduate classes. Students will pay tuition and fees to Kansas State.

#### **Handelshochschule Leipzig/Leipzig Graduate School of Management**

MBA students can take classes in English at one of the best business schools in Germany and learn German at the same time, if they wish. Students will pay tuition and fees to Kansas State. The university also offers a summer program on doing business in the European Union. Leipzig, with a population of half a million, is a major center of trade and culture, and offers beautiful buildings, fascinating museums, and an active nightlife.
