Every summer, Kansas State faculty members lead students on study abroad programs in Spain, usually to Granada or Salamanca. Students should investigate and sign up for these programs in the fall.

ISEP—International Student Exchange Program

Through ISEP, K-State students can study at seven universities in Spain while paying tuition, fees, room and board to Kansas State. At most universities on the ISEP exchange, students integrate into a Spanish university and take classes in Spanish with Spanish students. At least four semesters of college Spanish are required for exchange to those universities. A few universities on the ISEP exchange program offer intensive Spanish programs, and students at any level of Spanish may apply to those programs for full-time Spanish language study. These placements are highly competitive and deadlines are earlier than for other programs.

MAUI exchanges in Spain

Through KSU's membership in an organization called MAUI (Mid-America Universities International), students have the opportunity to study at the Complutense University of Madrid. The Complutense is one of the oldest universities in the world, as well as the largest and most prestigious in Spain. It has a staff of 10, 000 people and a student population of 117, 000. The university has courses in almost all KSU majors, but all classes will be in Spanish, so proficiency in Spanish language is required for entrance. On this exchange, students will pay tuition and fees to Kansas State and room and board to the host campus.
