## **K-State Exchanges** \*Out-of-state students pay in-state tuition!\*

### **University of Hertfordshire, Hertsfield, England**

An hour from London, the University of Hertfordshire gives you the best of both worlds: you'll live in an active university town with pubs, cinemas and shopping centers, but have easy access to the bustle and nightlife of London. Students will pay tuition and fees and K-State and housing costs to the host university. Take classes in art, business, biology, math, history, English, psychology and many other subjects. This exchange is best for a full-year or spring semester, since fall term runs until late January.

### **University College Cork, Cork, Ireland**

The beautiful campus of University College Cork is centered around a quadrangle of stone buildings and is located upon a riverside close to the city center. Cork, a busy seaport, is the second largest city in Ireland, and has a population of 150,000. Students can study just about anything, from anatomy to zoology. Through K-State's membership in the MAUI consortium, students will pay tuition and fees to KSU and housing and board to the host university. The deadline for applying to exchange through MAUI is in late February of each year.

### **CCIS programs in London and Lancaster, England**

Through CCIS, you can attend Kingston University in London. At Kingston University, all students take the course "British Culture and Society," and hear lectures on various aspects of British life, culture and history, followed by excursions to places of special interest. Students also pick three or four electives in the humanities, social sciences, science, engineering, and business. CCIS also offers a program at Edge Hill College in the northwest of England. Students can take classes in business, humanities, social sciences, sport sciences, environmental sciences, and education, among other subjects. Students live in campus residence halls and are completely integrated in with British students.

### **CCIS programs in Ireland and Scotland**

Spend a semester or a summer exploring Ireland. At the National University of Ireland (NUI) at Galway, students may take a wide variety of humanities and social sciences classes, while offerings in the sciences are available to Americans on a case-by-case basis. Galway is called the "Cultural Capital of Ireland" because of its strong theater and arts. At the University of Limerick, students can take classes in almost any area offered at Kansas State and will live with Irish students in two-story houses arranged in landscaped courtyards in a village style. NUI Maynooth is located in the suburb of Maynooth, fifteen miles by tram from the center of Dublin. CCIS students take classes in Irish literature, history, culture and politics, and choose one or two other classes in the humanities and social sciences.

## **IFSA-Butler programs in England, Scotland and Ireland**

IFSA specializes in study in the U.K., offering programs at ten universities in London, a dozen universities in the rest of England, six universities in Scotland, and nine universities in Ireland. All IFSA programs integrate American students into local university life as much as possible. IFSA provides extremely good support services to students, and programs also include excursions. IFSA works with some of the most prestigious universities in the U.K. and Ireland, such as Cambridge University, Oxford University, the University of St. Andrew's and University College Dublin. Special scholarships are often available through K-State.

## **ISA programs in Reading and London, England**

In London, students take classes at the University of Westminster, which offers a broad array of subjects to choose from. You'll take classes with British and other international students within almost any university department. Through ISA, students can enroll at the University of Reading. The University of Reading offers classes in many of the same areas taught at Kansas State, including agriculture. Reading is a historic city with Victorian red-brick buildings but is also a modern, lively city with great shopping and nightlife. In addition, London is less than half an hour by train!

## **API programs in Cork, Galway and Limerick, Ireland**

API offers several well-respected programs in Ireland. Students enroll in courses with Irish students and are generally allowed to select from the entire course offerings at each university. Classes are available in almost any KSU major! Americans will also live with Irish students and take part in university activities, so plan to make many new friends. Those attending the University College Cork may want to spend a semester earning a Certificate in Political Issues in Ireland, or a year earning a Certificate in Irish Studies. Students spending a fall semester in Cork may also participate in an early start program that allows them to earn additional credits. API also has programs in London at the University of the Arts and at London Metropolitan University, and a program at the University of Leeds.
