### **University of Canberra, Canberra, Australia**

Explore life "down under" in Australia's capital. This small and vibrant city is filled with students, who enjoy lively cafes, a hopping nightlife, and great, affordable restaurants. Canberra is also known for its abundance of parks, nature reserves, and lakeshores, and the numerous national parks located near the city make it an ideal base for exploring Australia's natural beauty. The Canberra campus offers classes in many disciplines, and the Brisbane campus specializes in business. On this exchange, students pay tuition and fees to Kansas State. Spend a semester in Australia or New Zealand through Australearn! Australearn offers programs at nineteen Australian universities and seven universities in New Zealand. Students can find any subject imaginable at one of these universities. Australearn provides on-site resident directors and aids students in navigating credit transfer, housing, visas and travel. You'll begin your program with an orientation, which will include an outdoor activity such as snorkeling on the Great Barrier Reef, and you'll have the chance spend a weekend volunteering on a wildlife conservation project. Australearn offers \$200,000 in scholarships a year, and many K-Staters have benefited from these. Students may also want to consider spending a semester or summer completing an internship through Australearn. Internships are available in many fields, such as sports marketing, public relations, social work, and zoology.
