5. Endow facility maintenance

We are prepared to accept gifts of stock and real property in addition to monetary contributions toward these goals. There are also numerous projects that volunteers can complete with little or no expense.

Gifts of any amount will certainly help to widen doors, renovate restrooms, and purchase fixtures. However, in addition to contributions toward the general renovation, there are a number of rooms available for adoption by individuals, churches and organizations.

21 rooms @ \$5,000 - primarily dorm rooms designed for two students.

6 rooms @ \$8,000 - larger rooms designed for three residents and public spaces like a prayer room and a study room.

6 rooms @ \$11,000-\$18,000 - public spaces and extra-large dorm rooms that will house four students each.

dedicated by Bishop Scott J. Jones as a place

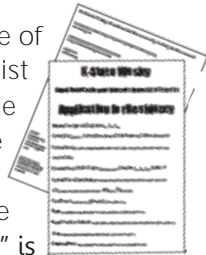


of Christian worship and

Why invest in campus ministry?

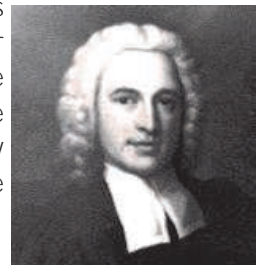


Well, many say that when we invest in
