Progress/accomplishments Top priorities moving forward

- Enterprise Systems Exploratory Task Force
 - Explore options available for future enterprise systems
 - Assess campus readiness for a change in ERP systems
 - Hosted vendor forums to share with campus the possibilities
 - IT is hosting listening sessions
 - Develop a report outlining ERP recommendations and next steps
- Enterprise Risk Framework
 - Establish the Enterprise Risk and Compliance Council
 - Identify and assess institutional risks
 - · Formulate and implement strategies to manage risks



Progress/accomplishments Top priorities moving forward

- Energy Savings and Sustainable Energy Committee
 - Committee recommended a variety of projects totaling \$25 million with a simple payback of
 7.5 years generating savings of \$3.3 million
 - Projects include interior/exterior lighting, building system enhancements, window films and utility system enhancements
 - Approved by President's Cabinet
- Association of Physical Plant Administrators (APPA) Report
 - Evaluation and assessment of the Facilities Services departments
 - Division of Facilities leadership evaluating the recommendations and will develop an implementation plan



Top priorities moving forward

- Laboratory Safety Renovation Program
 - Leverages up to \$1 million to address safety and compliance issues within research and teaching labs
 - Working group has been established and we will prioritize projects by end of the fall semester
- Academic Infrastructure Enhancement Fee Working Group
 - Committee of students, faculty and staff working to identify lecture halls and classrooms to renovate
 - Recommending renovation to large classroom Willard Hall Room 114
 - Renovations funded from the Academic Infrastructure Enhancement Fee implemented Fall 2017 - \$4/SCH



Top priorities moving forward

FACILITIES and INFRASTRUCTURE

- Multicultural Student Center
 - \$5.5 million project funded by private gifts
- McCain Auditorium renovations
 - \$6 million project funded by private gifts
- Electrical distribution system conversion
 - \$8.7 million project to update electrical systems
- Derby Dining Center renovations
 - \$16 million project funded from H&D revenue
- Mosier Hall renovations
 - \$8 million project funded from private funding
