


U.S. veterinary colleges ranked by cost

Top five least expensive








U.S. veterinary colleges ranked by cost







Student Outreach Resource Center

The Student Outreach Resource Center (SOURCE) at Johns Hopkins University College of Nursing allows students to immerse themselves in community service and realworld opportunities with more than 100 community-based organizations. The center provides students with servicelearning credit and a wide variety of options to participate in interprofessional outreach with colleagues from the university's schools of medicine and public health. Nellness on Wheels

In April 2021, the Kansas State University College of Veterinary Medicine's Wellness on Wheels, or WOW, whicle completed its first trip after more than two years of fundraising, design, and production. The vehicle allows members of the college's shelter medicine team to deliver basic veterinary care to pets whose owners have limited financial resources, physical limitations to access care, or insufficient knowledge about the importance of veterinary medicine. Providing routine client vellness exams through WOW gives students caseload experimence with the added value of serving populations with distinct demographic differences from the majority of veterinary school enrollment.






