Why is audio capture important?

- It can make or break a production
 - It clearly defines amateur from professional
 - It focuses viewers instead of distracting them
 - no one notices good sound
 - it only stands out when it's done poorly



Dual Audio Record

- On-camera microphones are not enough
 - Sound is often hollow, recorded directionally and can't be controlled manually
- Purchase, rent or borrow external recorder

Tips and Techniques

- Scout Location
 - Test equipment and levels
- Record Room Tone
 - 1-2 minutes
 - Saves your butt in post-production



Tips and Techniques

- Clapboard and camera mics
 - Sync audio up in production
- Headphones

- Check levels
- Check recordings frequently



Conclusion

- Dedicate someone to capture audio
- Know your equipment and your location
- Do it right the first time, you won't have to do it again
