Study Abroad (Semester)

Dublin, Ireland

Exchange Program: University College Dublin

About: The UCD exchange program features outstanding learning and research opportunities at one of the top-ranked institutions in the world. UCD has established a long and distinguished tradition of service to scholarship and to the community. Students may take courses, or "modules," in such fields as food and agribusiness management and agricultural and natural resource policy.

Perth, Australia

Exchange Program: University of Western Australia

About: UWA offers courses in nearly every discipline, from general education to more specialized coursework in agricultural science, business, conservation biology, environmental science, and more. Situated in the cosmopolitan and green city of Perth, UWA offers an abundance of outdoor activities in one of the safest large cities in the world. A minimum 3.0 GPA is required.

Nakhonpathom, Thailand

Program Provider: <u>Mahidol University International College</u>

About: Nakhonpathom is referred to as the oldest city in Thailand and is just a short distance from the capital of Bangkok. MUIC is the international component of Thailand's oldest university. In the Food Science and Technology program, students can receive theoretical and practical training and learn the chemistry, microbiology, structure, engineering, safety and nutrition of food as it is processed, packed, distributed, stored and used.

Montevideo, Uruguay

Program Provider: <u>USAC in Montevideo, Uruguay</u>

About: Montevideo is the capital of Uruguay and a port city known for its vibrant, laid-back lifestyle. Students can earn between 12 to 18 credits per semester comprised of Spanish language study plus electives in Latin American studies, agribusiness, business, viticulture, and gender studies. Students who enroll in the agribusiness or viticulture course will have the option to participate in a Viticulture Field Study to local wineries to learn about the viticulture process.

Accra, Ghana

Program Provider: <u>USAC African Studies in Ghana</u>

About: Accra is Ghana's capital and largest city. This economic, political, and social center is rich with history and culture. Students on this program can take a combination of courses for study abroad students and classes with local students at the

University of Ghana at Legon from the College of Agriculture and Consumer Sciences. Students can participate in service-learning alongside their classes at the Accra Zoo or West African Primate Conservation Action among others.

Study Abroad (Summer)

Toulouse, France

Exchange Program: École Supérieur d'Ingénieurs, Purpan

About: At the heart of one of the most important agricultural regions in Europe, Purpan balances an authentic French experience with accessibility to many of the continent's major urban and cultural centers. Purpan offers a customizable summer program with 4-week, 6-week and 8-week options. The 4-week session includes academic courses; however, students can add on a 2-week study tour in the Dordogne agricultural region of Southwestern France, or a 4-week internship/homestay where students help on a local farm within their industry of interest. Students take courses within 2 different tracks: the French & EU Agriculture study program and either the Agricultural/Food or Viticulture/Oenology study program.

Faculty-led Programs (Winter or Summer)

Agriculture students also have the opportunity to participate in short-term (1-3 week) programs led by K-State faculty members. Faculty-led programs allow students to travel with other K-State students and earn KSU credit. Past Agriculture-related programs have included visits to Brazil, China, South Africa and Spain. Serve or Intern Abroad

South Africa, Dominican Republic, Gambia, Paraguay, and Kenya International Service Teams

About: International Teams is a service-learning program of interdisciplinary teams of Kansas State University students. Teams travel and live in communities around the world during the summer break. International Teams work with community partners to engage in local community work abroad on a variety of meaningful projects. Previous placements have focused on health, education, environmental and sustainability concerns, and youth development.

Various Locations in Latin America, Africa and Asia-Pacific Kaya Responsible Travel (Unaffiliated)

About: Kaya offers a variety of meaningful internship and volunteer placements working with animal welfare and environmental conservation. Participants are able to gain hands on experience with organizations operating in a variety of fields that benefit communities and environments in Latin America, Africa and Asia.
