Study Abroad (Semester)

Hirakata City (Osaka), Japan

[Exchange program: Kansai Gaidai University](#)

About: Located in Hirakata City, Osaka, Kansai Gaidai is accessible, within a one-hour train ride, to Kyoto and Nara, the ancient capitals, and Osaka, the second largest business hub in Japan. KGU welcomes about 700 international students from all over the world each year. In addition to language classes for all levels, students at KGU can take numerous Anthropology courses in English.

Bangalore, India

About: Live and study in the dynamic city of Bangalore, take courses related to your major, and participate in service learning opportunities on one of the most affordable semester programs. Known for its numerous and highly spirited festivals such as Holi and Diwali, you are sure to experience the vitality of Indian true culture during all times of the year. Cusco, Peru

About: Once the capital of the Inca empire, Cusco is nestled in the Andes Mountains at 11,000 feet. Visit the nearby World Heritage site of Machu Picchu, take Bachata dance lessons, and begin or improve your Spanish language skills. You can also study subjects taught in English like People and Cultures of Peru, Indigenous Peoples Movements, and Archaeology, Heritage, and Tourism.

Study Abroad (Summer)

Prague, Czech Republic

Accra, Ghana

About: Accra is Ghana's capital and largest city made up of numerous neighborhoods, each with its own distinct flavor. It is home to the National Museum, The Ghana Academy of Arts and Sciences, and the Ghanaian National Archives. Over the summer, students can study the Twi language, Histories and Cultures of Africa, African Music and Dance, and participate in a Ghanaian Traditional Arts & Cuisine Workshop!

Orvieto, Italy

About: Located in the Italian hill town of Orvieto, and centrally located between Rome and Florence, with both cities just a short train ride away. This is KSU's premiere summer study abroad program in Italy and is open to all students and majors. Students will study with KSU faculty members at the Centro Studi Citta di Orvieto and earn KSU credit.
