

# Social Work Abroad

## Timeline for Your Adventure

- Contact an Education Abroad Advisor to discuss your program options: Call 785-532-5990 to schedule an appointment
- Contact your Academic Advisor to discuss how education abroad fits in with your degree plans
- K-State's Social Work Program is very specific in terms of the courses that need to be taken junior and senior year because of the Practice Sequence. Most Social Work credits abroad do not transfer back equally because of the specificity. It is best to go abroad sometime sophomore year or during a summer. While abroad, it is possible to take a variety of classes in different areas to meet general education requirements, elective credits, or for a minor.
  - *Freshman Year:* Come into 304 Fairchild to learn more. If you want to go first semester of sophomore year you will need to apply in the spring of your freshman year.
  - *Sophomore Year:* Go abroad in either the fall or spring. If you go abroad in the spring, your deadlines will be in the fall before you go.
  - *Junior Year:* Go abroad during the summer before your junior year.

## Study Abroad (Semester)

### Melbourne, Australia

*Exchange program: Deakin University*

Deakin University offers a full complement of specialized and general education courses, making this a good fit for most SASW students. Set in Melbourne, Australia's second largest city and rated one of the world's most livable cities, the campus allows easy access to beaches and many of the country's cultural institutions.

### Hirakata City, Japan

*Exchange program: Kansai Gaidai University*

Hirakata City is located in the Osaka region, which is the second largest business metropolis in Japan. Kansai Gaidai welcomes about 700 international students each year. In addition to language classes, students take courses in English across Anthropology, History, Political Science, Gender Studies, and Art courses.

### Hatfield, United Kingdom

*Exchange program: University of Hertfordshire*

An hour from London, the University of Hertfordshire gives you the best of both worlds. You'll live in an active university town with pubs, cinemas, and shopping centers but have easy access to the bustle of London. Coursework is broad enough to satisfy the needs of most majors.

### Orvieto, Italy
