Study Abroad (Semester)

Melbourne, Australia

[Exchange program: Deakin University](#)

About: Deakin University offers a complimentary curriculum to K-State, making it a good fit for most majors. Melbourne is rated one of the world's most livable cities, with easy access to beaches and many of the country's cultural institutions.

Hatfield, United Kingdom

About: An hour from London, the University of Hertfordshire gives you the best of both worlds. You'll live in an active university town with pubs, cinemas, and shopping centers but have easy access to the bustle of London. Coursework is broad enough to satisfy the needs of most majors.

Nakhonpathom, Thailand

Florence, Italy

Orvieto, Italy

This is KSU's premiere summer study abroad program in Italy and is open to all students and majors. Students will study with KSU faculty members at the Centro Studi Citta di Orvieto and earn KSU credit.
