About the Institute:

Kansas State University has hosted an annual assessment conference since 2007. The conference started as an opportunity to bring the assessment message to Kansas State faculty and staff. It has since grown to include participants from across Kansas, as well as other states in the region. The Annual Institute for Student Learning Assessment provides valuable opportunities for higher education professionals to enhance their knowledge of assessment and to share their own experiences and assessment practices.

About K-State and Manhattan:

Manhattan, Kansas was founded by accident in 1855 by passengers of the steamboat Hartford when it ran aground in the Kansas River. Today, about 50,000 people live in Manhattan, officially nicknamed "The Little Apple" in 1977. We are home to the Kansas State University Wildcats, The Flint Hills Discovery Center, AZA accredited Sunset Zoo, Tuttle Creek State Park, Konza Prairie, and neighbor to Fort Riley, home of the legendary 1st Infantry Division, "The Big Red One." In 2011, Forbes Magazine rated Manhattan No. 1 for "Best Small Communities for a Business and Career."



Kansas State University is recognized by the Princeton Review as one of America's best colleges, and U.S. News & World Report lists the university among the top 75 public universities in the U.S. K-State is implementing an aggressive plan to become a top 50 public research university

by 2025. As the first land grant university under the Morrill Act, Kansas State University opened its doors in 1863 on the grounds of the old Bluemont Central College.

Exhibits will be located on the 2nd Floor Concourse of the K-State Student Union. All general sessions and breakouts will take place on this floor. Exhibit space will be pre-assigned and identified with placards.


