

Review of Fall 2008

- Largest career fair yet at K-State
 - All University Career Fair 341 employers and over 5000 attendees
- Steady on-campus interviewing
 - 172 companies in fall 2008 compared to 177 in fall 2007
- Most K-State students ever "registered" with CES during fall semester 7,524
- Increased workshop and presentation attendance
 - Midnight Resume Madness 211 students up from 144
 - Nonprofit Careers 88 students and community members
 - Dining Etiquette 118 students
- Strong use of individual career advising including Walk-In Wednesday
 - 360 WiW drop-ins during fall 2008 compared to 339 in fall 2007
 - o 860 scheduled appointments in fall 2008 compared to 607 in fall 2007
- Latest post-graduation statistics reveal little change in employment and educational outcomes for 2007-08 undergraduate degree recipients
 - o 72% employed, 20% further education, 2% other, 6% seeking
- BUT disintegration of job market increasingly evident
 - Increased Alumni Career Services activity
 - Some reports of rescinded job offers
 - Decreased spring career fair employer registration
 - o Increased job search activity among students in previously "hot" disciplines

- Redesigned based on recruiter feedback and for more strategic employer branding
- Leverages partnership synergies among CES, Student Life and K-State's Corporate and Foundation Relations
- Provides access to engagement opportunities throughout the University
