Class Expectations:

- 1. Buy the books for the class and bring them every day.
- 2. Come to class prepared with paper and pencils.
- 3. Come to class on time. Students are expected to be in seated in the classroom with all required materials when class begins. If for some reason you are late and the class has started, enter the room quietly.
- 4. Pay attention and write down important information and homework assignments.
- 5. Cell phones, iPods or other electronic devices <u>MUST BE ON SILENT</u> during class. They should be kept in your backpack or bag; if found in use WITHOUT YOUR TEACHER'S PERMISSION, you will lose participation points.
- 6. Do your homework completely and do it well. Hand it in on time with your name on the paper. Do your own work. You learn only if you practice by doing the work yourself.
- 7. If you are sick, e-mail your teacher or call the ELP office (532-7324). When you come back to class, check on what homework you missed. If you miss class, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed while you were gone.
- 8. **Check your K-State Webmail account regularly.** Your instructor and the ELP program will communicate important information through K-State Webmail.
- 9. You are not allowed to video record, photograph, or audio record your ELP classes without prior permission from the instructor and written permission of classmates.
- 10. You must follow and respect the University policy on Academic Honesty. "On my honor as a student I have neither given nor received unauthorized aid on this academic work."
 - a. This means that you do not copy another student's work, and you do not allow another student to copy your work.
 - b. It also means that you do not copy from other sources. This applies to tests and homework assignments. See A (in Important Notes section): University Policy on Academic Dishonesty.

Textbooks:

You should have <u>completely new</u> textbooks by the end of the first week of class. If you buy used ones, the content must be erased. After the first week of class, you receive **0** points for participation if you do not have a new or clean textbook.

Participation Points Guidelines:

You will receive two (2) points if: • you are on time for class, • you are prepared for class, • and you participate in class. Required Course Work:

- **Non-graded homework** is due at the beginning of class. It cannot be turned in late. In case of illness, the instructor will accept the homework up to 24 hours after the student returns to class.
- **Graded homework** is due at the beginning of class. It will be accepted up to 24 hours after it is due, but you will lose half (1/2) of the points. If you are sick, homework will be accepted up to 24 hours after you return to class.
- Quizzes If you miss a quiz, you will get a score of 0. There is no make-up.
- Coordinated Tests check your class Course Policy for dates.

DO NOT plan to travel before all quizzes, achievement tests, and make-up tests are finished For Fall 2017, you are free to travel on <u>December 12, 2017.</u>

Student Concerns about Grades:

If you have questions about a grade, talk to your instructor. Talk to your teacher within 4 days of the grade being posted in the online gradebook. Students are expected to talk first with an instructor about any class situation. You may speak with an ELP advisor if you have more questions. Questions about earlier grades will not be discussed during the last 3 weeks of the semester. Keep all of your graded work until the end of the semester. Check your progress in the K-State Online Canvas grade book regularly.
