 - A. Undergraduate Education –
 1. A motion was made by Spears and seconded by Roberts to approve the following course and curriculum changes approved by the College of Agriculture on October 19, 2009 (see approval sheets for complete details):

CURRICULUM CHANGES

Agricultural Economics

Changes to: B.S. Degree in Agribusiness – International Option

- Add FINAN 450 Principles of Finance to the Finance Requirement section
- Change the Agricultural Economics restricted elections from 6 to 9 credits.

RATIONALE: The proposed change will make the finance requirement in the International Option consistent with the finance requirement of the other two options in the agribusiness curriculum. In making the change, AGECE 513 is moved from being listed as a required course to being listed as being another course in the list of choices of restricted agricultural economics courses. A footnote will be added, just as it is on the other two options in the agribusiness curriculum, indicating that either AGECE 513 or FINAN 450 is required in the curriculum. To keep the total number of AGECE credits unchanged, the required total AGECE restricted electives is increased from 6 to 9 credits.

IMPACT: The Finance Department has been contacted and has indicated this is not a problem.

General Agriculture

Discontinue the Contemporary Citizenship in Agriculture Minor

RATIONALE: There is currently only one student enrolled in this minor program, and the program has never had strong student interest as exhibited by enrollment. The GENAG 450 course no longer has an instructor.

IMPACT: None.

Horticulture, Forestry and Recreation Resources

Changes to: Park Management and Conservation Major – Park Management Option

- Add BIOL 198 Principles of Biology to the list of Natural Sciences and allow students to take either BIOL 198 or BIOL 210.
- Delete BIOL 320 from the specialization section

RATIONALE: Biology Department has not taught BIOL 210 or BIOL 320 for several recent semesters. These changes do not result in a change in the total number of hours required for the degree nor in free electives.

IMPACT: No impact on other departments.

- Add BIOL 198 Principles of Biology to the list of Natural Sciences and allow students to take either BIOL 198 or BIOL 210.
- Delete BIOL 320 from the specialization section

RATIONALE: To broaden the designated electives for the Turf Management and Specialization category to reflect a wider range of transfer and KSU courses that meet the spirit of the elective category, and to allow students and advisors more flexibility in meeting the details of the curriculum.

IMPACT: No impact on other departments.

A question was asked about adding and deleting courses within curricula, whether compensation is made and another course is removed or added in. It was discussed that the college course and curriculum committee makes a number of decisions about how they run their academic programs and it should not be our place to second guess, but if there are conflicts between colleges in course offerings, guidance should be offered. Also briefly discussed is what items the Kansas Board of Regents approves. Motion carried.

2. A motion was made by Spears and seconded by Devore to approve the following curriculum changes approved by the College of Education on October 27, 2009 (see approval sheets for complete detail):

Rationale: These changes are initiated at the request of the Department of Journalism and Mass Communications. Additionally, the current course numbers for two of the “recommended” courses are corrected to reflect changes in course numbering in the Department of Journalism and Mass Communications, one course title is updated, and three courses have been added to the list of recommend courses.

Changes to English and Journalism (EDENJ) Teacher Licensure Program

- Remove MC 211 and 276 from required courses
- Add MC 251 and 406 to required courses

Rationale: These changes are initiated at the request of the Department of Journalism and Mass Communications. As this department has made programmatic changes to bolster their emphasis on electronic journalism, their faculty recommend two courses currently required in the EDENJ sequence be replaced with two other courses that better align with the needs of secondary school journalism teachers.

- A. CAPP- Andrew Bennett

Bennett reported that conversation regarding offering a stand-alone minor was a major part of the meeting. Also discussed was how we are going to get iSIS to do certain technical things.

- B. iSIS Steering Committee – Dan Moser

Wait lists were reviewed as far as how to preserve and allow for them in a new system. They're also still working with the fit/gap analysis. The Academic advising module was talked about. A group will be put together made up of advisors and others to offer a variety of input regarding our advising needs. Other more technical issues were also touched on.

- C. Student Senate – Wayne Stoskopf

King reported in behalf of Stoskopf who could not be present due to other committee responsibilities. The Student Senate has passed out the allocations for Educational Opportunity Fund and the Student Centered Tuition Enhancements Committee has started meeting. Applications for funding through SCTE are due Friday, December 4th.

6. Old Business

- A. Stand alone minor – CAPP

Wheatley began by passing out a revised document. She reported that what was discussed last time she visited the meeting regarding other big 12 schools was not accurate. Changes were made to the second paragraph from the last version regarding the bachelors or master degree being earned from k-state. An exception may be requested by a college if they wish to award a minor to someone who did not earn a degree here at Kansas State University. Also addressed was the comment from last time that financial aid wouldn't be available. It was offered that a student could apply for loans as other individuals going back to school could. Also, students who would enter as non-degree seeking students would enroll after others and so this would not greatly affect current students' abilities to enroll in a course they want. Dean Wheatley opened the floor for comment or questions. A comment was made that when the second paragraph talks about exceptions, is the exception for the student, on a case by case basis, or is it an exception for the entire program, and who approves the exception. To whom would a college apply to allow an exception? Many other editorial comments were made and suggestions to the language in the proposal. It was commented that a good number of credits can be transferred in to get a major at k-state. So if we're not devaluing our major programs, this should not devalue our minor programs. Discussion leaned again towards wondering if this is the best avenue of approach for this need. There is concern we are redefining what a minor really is at K-State. Other questions came up such as how would a request for a minor that was not housed in a certain department or unit apply for this. Various other questions were brought up in the length of this conversation. It was commented that it seems academic certificates can cover most needs, but this will be a creative approach to changing industry desires. How should this be moved forward while also having a conversation about what to do with minors that fall outside of the flowchart that we have in place. Devore, Hornsby, Moser, Spears will work on this and Spears will work with Dean Wheatley to finalize language for the proposal.
