Bormann made a motion and it was seconded by Hageman to approve the PAS courses above. Discussion: Bormann provided background for why this program and all the courses are moving forward at an accelerated pace. Easton discussed the detailed process of the steps it went through. The timeline was shared with members.

Various comments and questions were addressed. It was asked what SCPE stands for. This stands for "supervised clinical practical experience." With that in mind it was asked if courses PAS 870 and 890 should also have the SCPE on them as well. Yes – that will be added. Additionally, the prerequisite didn't seem to clearly define what expectations are. It was responded that more detailed information will be in the didactic handbook for the student. However, an additional sentence can be added in the Curriculog field where appropriate for these courses. It was mentioned that it is important to identify what will be displayed in the catalog, such as the specific curriculum and graduation requirements, along with a definition of what the didactic phase includes. This will be worked on in order to be included with the information Faculty Senate receives at their meeting next week.

Motion carried to approve the courses. A motion was made by Bormann and seconded by Almes to approve the new program. As requested, a document outlining the curriculum summary will be provided. Motion carried.

General discussion occurred regarding the accelerated path for this new curriculum as well as the overall future of the routing and approval process. Members brainstormed about online voting versus in-person meetings and so on. This is a fundamental conversation that will continue as the instruction manual and policies continue to be worked on this year.
