There was discussion surrounding GENBA 195, but mainly regarding information found in the syllabus. The concern, when reading through the syllabus, is that the course is for 1st semester freshman, but those students are also expected to be in SALES 542, which is a junior/senior course. Thoughts were to reduce that particular SALES course number to a lower level and perhaps removing the 400-level pre-req. There was no objection to the GENBA course, but it seemed the college needs to discuss the overall changes to their SALES courses and discuss the CAT community as it pertains to these courses. Von Bergen will follow up with the unit on the comments made here today. It was reiterated that the syllabus is not what we're approving.

Motion carried to approve GENBA 195. Motion carried to approve all other courses from Business Administration.

Easton made a motion to move the BS in Computer Science to a standard process due to impact with Business Administration. Approved. This curriculum proposals will also need to be held until the new ENTRP courses from Business are approved.

A question was raised about the economics BA/BS proposal and the MATH pre-req in one of the statistics courses that had been changed in the curriculum. After discussion, it was agreed the expedited path is correct, however, members would still like follow up to occur on the question before finalizing it. Motion was made by Easton to table the BA/BS in Economics until verification can be made with Econ and/or the Stat department. Seconded by Von Bergen. Motion carried.

6. A motion was made and seconded to approve the December 2019 graduation list as submitted by the Registrar's office. Motion carried.

#### 7. Unfinished Business

A. Approval, Routing, and Notification manual discussion –
Easton reported he has not had feedback from CAPP. Registrar and Provost office would still like to give feedback and considering the circumstances the university is undergoing, it was agreed that having more time for feedback is reasonable. The idea is this will be back on the agenda in late April or first May meeting. It is still hoped to have this in place for use in the Fall.

### 8. Announcements/for the good of the University

- A. FS elections ongoing election of AAC chair(s) later this semester

  Members were reminded there is a need for a new co-chair for the 20-21 year. Von Bergen has

  offered to continue to chair or co-chair if that is the committee's desire. An election will occur in May.
- B. A/Pass/Fail and Cr/NCr grading options There was considerable discussion surrounding the change to online learning due to COVID-19 and the impact to students and their grades. Niehoff reported the deans met a week ago and stated they wouldn't be altering the process; however, after much feedback and request, they met again yesterday and this is now under discussion. Several committee members, invited guests, and liaisons weighed in and listened to feedback. Many universities around the country are having these same conversations.

Several thoughtful questions and comments were made regarding both the A/Pass/Fail and Cr/NCr options. This is a student opt-in decision; however, the date for when students opt in can be adjusted. Given the circumstances, this will be a decision administration needs to make. It was recommended to be as flexible as possible while considering the best outcome for our students, however, unintended consequences may occur and need considered.

All agreed this is a very complex issue. Not all will be happy, whatever the decision, but consultation has been occurring.
