A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Bormann to approve the AG course proposals. There were some questions on the UFS courses (791, 794, and 796). These are going to be cross-listed with HORT courses, so we should make sure they match. All agreed with this. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Dodd to approve the AS course proposals. Motion carried. **Update** – ART 365 can be expedited as the K-State 8 tag is remaining the same; it was initially thought to be removed.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Bormann to approve the BA course proposal. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Sevin to approve the ED course proposal. A brief question was asked to be sure the K-State 8 tag content would still be covered. Greg Eiselein was present and confirmed this. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Bormann to approve the EN course proposals. There was a recommendation to add a note to NE 691/891 to clarify to students they can take one or the other of the courses for credit, but not both. Amir Bahadori was present and confirmed this was agreeable to the department. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Bormann to approve the HHS course proposals. There was a brief comment made on FNDH 426 that verification had been received the change to the curriculum where the acctg course had been removed was fairly recent and that had been agreed to with acct, therefore, the lack of notification here was not a concern. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Almes to approve the Olathe course proposals. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Dodd to approve the new curriculum proposals from HHS. There were questions raised about the new minor in Philanthropy. Main questions were whether this is truly to be offered to non-K-State graduates and whether this needs KBOR approval. The first question was addressed that it is not intended for non-K-State graduates and that wording will be removed. There was some uncertainty as to whether KBOR approval was needed. It was recommended this be tabled to inquire further. Motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by

Bormann to table this proposal until the next meeting. Motion carried. **Update**: It was verified via the provost office this new minor will need KBOR approval as a new minor in an area of study where no existing board approved degree program exists. Additional paperwork will be provided and this will be back on the next agenda of FS Academic Affairs for action.

The motion carried to approve the new minor in Pre-Couple & Family Therapy and the new Philanthropy certificate.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Bormann to approve the AS curriculum proposal. There was conversation regarding the last paragraph in the new language related to graduate certificates that could be taken to fulfill certain requirements. After discussion, it appeared this was more confusing and better left out. Melinda Cro was in attendance and was agreeable to that change. A revised file will be uploaded to Curriculog. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Bormann to approve the ED curriculum proposal. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Dodd to approve the HHS curriculum changes. There was brief discussion about the Early Childhood Education BS. Two words had been left out in two places (for licensure) that should have been included. Mary DeLuccie provided this information and this was agreeable to committee members and a revised file will be uploaded. Additionally, there was a minor change in the IHS proposal. One sentence was added in the main description portion to provide clarity for students. Senator Dodd had reached out to Kari Morgan about his change and this was agreeable. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Bormann to approve the Olathe curriculum proposals. Motion carried.

There was discussion that the Intercultural Competence Certificate had been on the wrong list and is actually "standard." It had be submitted initially in Curriculog as an expedited change, but was then noted as being standard and since Curriculog does not automatically change the work flow once initially selected, it was still showing up as expedited. That being said, there were still questions. There was no file showing where the additional courses should show up on the curriculum. Also, notification from units who had courses added should be included. This will be followed up on. Alisa Wolfe was in attendance to represent this proposal and will take the information back to her unit head. A motion was made by Von Bergen and seconded by Almes to table this proposal until the next meeting so a file can be uploaded and confirmation of notification can be provided. Motion carried.

Motion carried to approval all other expedited changes. **Update**: it was noted in Curriculog that MC 623 should be standard proposal as it is combining courses. This will be moved to the "standard" list.
