Since, in future, there will be a change to the certificate policy overall, it was wondered if we can edit this particular proposal now so it won't need amended later. The note about having a "C or better on all certificate courses" was agreed to be updated to say that "a C or better is required on all Kinesiology courses." This edit will be made to the proposal. Some clarification was also provided that this certificate is available to anyone who is interested, this includes current students and it can be taken as a freestanding certificate as well. Motion carried.

Side note: In conversation regarding certificates, it was noted that some clarifying definitions may be needed, perhaps in the ARN manual as well as the handbook related to free standing.
