8) New Business

a) <u>Proposal: Transition PB Minor to Traditional Minor Model</u> – First Reading

Brundage explained that a year ago, the student government took on this project to do some research on transitioning the post-baccalaureate minor to a traditional minor model. Brundage explained that a post-baccalaureate minor does not exist, there is no credential for it. This program was created by K-State around 2010-2013. Since that time, they've learned a post-bacc cannot be reported because it is not a valid credential and creates a lot of problems for students and staff. Only 91 people have received it since 2012, and the group that advocated for it has never graduated a student with this minor. This document provides a transition option, which provides a credential that a student can walk into. This step is needed to remove the post-bacc minor and to help students choose what they will do as they transition out of this program. Goos agreed to create the forms needed to pass it as a handbook change and bring it back to AAC in two weeks and then send it through the approval process as a package.

- b) Elections Kouba ascertained that Senator Wefald is up for re-election and will let the committee know if he chooses to run again. Senator Bilgili let everyone know he is stepping down from Academic Affairs after this year. Kouba asked if anyone has interested in being a co-chair to talk her or others on the committee.
- c) Proposed Class Time Changes This proposal is at CAPP and they have not met yet. Discussion followed. Brundage and Goos gave input that if it was approved, the earliest it would be implemented would be Fall 2026. Because it is a structural change, it requires time to change it.

- b) Library Senator Alford reported that the Library Committee has had discussions about not being sure why they exist. It used to be that they were supposed to oversee operations, but that was rewritten just a couple years ago that they now serve as a conduit between the faculty and staff and the Library. Alford said he would talk to a couple people and see if he could get some answers and feedback.
