Guest: Jodi Kaus presented information to senators regarding Powercat Financial and information on the Federal Loan Forgiveness Program.

Standing committee and Student Senate reports:

- Academic Affairs: A handbook change to Section F115 and F115.1 was made to include all modalities in the credit hour definitions.
- Faculty Affairs: A handbook change to section C6 was made to update information related to Student Organizations.
- Professional Staff Affairs: The Docking Institute Survey was completed last fall and the results were presented to President Myers and some cabinet members. They are working with USS senate and Communications and Marketing to disseminate the results to the campus. They will set up listening sessions for staff at K-State and will work with Dr. Grice in Communications and Marketing to come up with a communication strategy.
- Student Senate: Annual fall visits are being scheduled by the President and Provost, Jansen Penny, Hannah Heatherman and Peter Moyer. They are in the process of putting together 10-year strategic plan for SGA and reviewing resource utilization. The Tuition and Fees Strategies Committee (TFSC) has been meeting this semester and the Health and Human Sciences fee will be voted on.
- Technology (FSCOT): October is <u>Cyber Security Awareness month</u>. All were reminded of being cyber smart by the slogan "<u>Own IT secure IT protect IT</u>. Shred It Day was <u>October</u> <u>23rd</u>; remember, not everything is able to be shredded. Update was provided related to the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) task force work.
- University Planning (FSCOUP): No report.
