

	human social systems" and "Purpose: to acquaint students with the adaptation of scientific method to the analysis of human social systems." Within the list of approved courses it states: "The fourth course must be form the above areas or from:Linguistics - any course except LG 601." It
	is based on the acceptance of any linguistics courses (aside from LG 601) that this porposal is being submitted. The course GRMN 528 is a general introduction to the study of language as system of human communication,
	with particular focus on the German language. The proposal also seeks to add the K-State 8 tag: social sciences for the same reasoning. This proposal also makes a few other minor changes (e.g. a change in pre-
	requisite). It should be noted that GRMN 528 is taught in German and the textbook is written in that language, but that the linguistics concepts learned (phonetics, morphology, syntax, etc.) apply to the scientific study of any language.






