1. President Don Von Bergen called the meeting to order, and the Land Acknowledgment was played.
2. Approval of October 31st Executive Committee minutes

Faculty Affairs spent time between the last senate meeting and today reviewing suggested amendments from the various caucuses. All amendments submitted were discussed. These were incorporated as appropriate and are in the attachment. They believe these updates make for a better overall proposal. Most of the feedback received made it into the proposal. Even so, the

committee anticipates there may be at least one additional amendment requested at the upcoming senate meeting.

Senator Cunningham moved to place the proposed addition to the university handbook, Appendix Y, on the upcoming Faculty Senate agenda for action.

Discussion:

Clarification was asked for about submitting future amendments and it was suggested those be dealt with by caucus chairs. It seemed reasonable that caucus chairs could streamline the amendment process and discussion by initiating and encouraging discussions with their caucus members.

All were reminded as well that Candace puts a note in the Faculty Senate meeting email that requests any amendments on action items to be submitted in writing as this is helpful. It was suggested highlighting this reminder.

Senator Cunningham anticipates there may be an amendment regarding twelve month language. They have discussed as a committee and are prepared to address any questions. A senator noted he will share more of a typographical or style edit.

President Von Bergen reminded senators that due to the unique and diverse work that colleges and departments do, there will be some areas that will not fit well and will need to be adjusted.

5. Announcements

A. [KBOR meeting report](#)

President Von Bergen and President Elect Douthit did not attend the KBOR meeting due to their participation in the Association of Public Land grant Universities (APLU) annual meeting in Seattle, WA. There were 250 public schools represented and one of the big pushes from this event was the need for institutions to advance in the AI realm. Some of the topics that were discussed included how to use AI in the future to be better instructors and more efficient administrators. Within two or three years they anticipate vendors to inundate institutions with programs to run HR, finance, departments.

Another interesting topic was the need for university wide processes for crisis management, for example: campus shooters, strikes and hazing deaths due to alcohol poisoning, etc.

There was a lot of discussion regarding the diminishing public perception of the benefit of a college education.

President Von Bergen's sub for the KBOR meeting, the faculty senate president from Wichita State, engaged KBOR in discussions about their plan for adding two more faculty awards by next fall. The faculty senate presidents requested to play a role as KBOR interviews to replace the Academic Committee Chair, this is exciting news as the academic committee greatly impacts policies that need to be implemented.

An announcement went out in the November 21st K-State Today and President Von Bergen also sent an email reminder out to faculty and professional staff yesterday morning. Past President Saucier shared information about the survey put out. They answer to the Provost and Chief Technology officer. President Von Bergen, and Senators Raine and Saucier encouraged senators to take the survey and noted the importance of receiving feedback from faculty to better support classrooms. Aside from the feedback surrounding technology the Teaching and Learning Spaces Work Group will also use the feedback to fuel their efforts in the improvement of classroom spaces. Equipment, physical space, architecture, facilities, tech, keeping in mind that the classroom is six-sided. Innovation is encouraged. One senator noted they plan to add more suggestions to the survey; the survey can be taken more than once in order to ensure that everyone shares as many comprehensive ideas as they can. There was a request to share the results of the survey to utilize the feedback on the current renovations planned in the college of Agriculture.

C. Guest for December FS meeting: New Chief Technology Officer: Thomas Bunton

Our new Chief Technology Officer's schedule was not going to allow him to attend in person on December 12th and therefore he will visit Faculty Senate at their February meeting. A senator inquired if we should invite another guest. It was suggested not having a guest in order to continue being cognizant of everyone's time and focusing on the discussion surrounding the workload policy.
