- Call to Order Faculty Affairs Don Saucier
- **President Mindy Markham:** Charge to the Faculty Affairs Committee re: Term Employee representation on Faculty Senate
  - o There are a number of issues related to term employees

  - o Come up with suggestions for what that would look like on the faculty side
  - There could be a shift in numbers of faculty senators. Need to look at those numbers
  - Discuss the title/name of Faculty Senate
  - o President Markham will provide additional data to the committee
  - Committee had quick discussion about the definition of "term employee"; background about why this is a priority for faculty senate; there will probably need to be specific policy language that is consistent throughout all univ. departments; suggestion to have general counsel come to FA meeting; philosophical debate about the definition of "faculty"

- Salaries and Fringe Benefits Committee: Todd Easton
  - Have been meeting weekly
  - o Requested numbers and data on salary reports
  - Dependent and spouse tuition benefit for regular employees. Long-term "term" employees are now being denied assistance. Looking to draft new policy suggestion to include term employees
  - How to get faculty pay raises. 5% furlough in exchange for 5% raise
  - Committee discussion about tuition benefit: Good idea to have a "years of experience" requirement; 3-5 years of employment seems like a good range; market this as a reason to retain quality employees

  - Group looked at what the road map looks like for term employee discussions
