Here's a short summary:

- The prices of educational books and supplies rose dramatically from 1983 to 2016, compared to the CPI (consumer price index) of all goods. Prices have somewhat stabilized from 2016-current, most likely from market trends and efforts of universities to stabilize the textbook market, with OER efforts being a factor.
- If K-State values educational affordability for our students, our aim should be to help continue the stabilization trend.
- Major textbook publishers (Pearson, McGraw-Hill, Cengage, etc.) and college textbook vendors (Follett, Barnes & Noble, EBSCO, and ed-tech companies) are relying on the following to reverse the price stabilization trend:
 - Inclusive access – textbook pricing and delivery model.
 - Not discussed on April 5th
 - Portals – interconnected textbook discovery, adoption, and store web interfaces
 - “Discover” is Follett’s portal product, linking course material discovery, adoption, and purchasing.
 - Wrappers – Educational learning platforms that “wrap” around content, like OER(free) material, and charges users for its use.
 - Lumen Learning (<https://lumenlearning.com/follett/>), wasn’t discussed on April 5th but FSCOT members should be aware of it if you’re not already. Lumen sits at the intersection of our conversation on educational learning platforms, like TopHat, and our current discussions on Follett.
 - Focus on e-materials – With (very) little exception, digital materials are licensed rather than “owned.”
 - Systematic degradation of the first-sale doctrine for textbooks, weakening of the secondary textbook market. i.e. Less options for students to purchase/access course material other than publisher sourcing.
- Improving business processes of K-State and contracted bookstore is an important consideration. K-State course material affordability programs should be integrated with the course material reporting pipeline to improve business processes.

Nathan Vontz's, SGA representative, input on this issue will be valuable since SGA has been vocal opponents of things that would result in higher costs to students, especially textbooks.
