- 1. Demonstration for faculty and student side of Follett Discover
- 2. Questions
 - a. Michael Raine: Is there a cost? **There is no cost for Follett Discover. The only thing we need is someone on your side to install the LTI.**
 - b. Kelley Brundage: Are there limits on licenses or how many can access at any time? **There are no limits on how many can access.**
 - c. Brett DePaola: By what mechanism (or at what point) does this online application for texts satisfy existing laws on textbook cost transparency (to the student)? It will help us to acquire adoptions faster and easier. This will help make it easier for faculty to submit their adoptions. With better adoption collection, we will be able to provide the required information to students sooner and for more courses.
 - d. Kelley Brundage: Would this only cover Manhattan campus courses or all of our courses and locations (Olathe, Salina, Manhattan)? **This will cover all locations.**
 - e. Colby Moorberg: Does it search open textbook indexes, such as Open Stax? Yes, it does. Openstax is one of our biggest suppliers of OER.
 - f. Phil Vardiman If a professor develops an Open Textbook at no cost to the student will there be a fee for the students to access these materials through this access portal? There will be no fee if it an Open textbook. Follett Discover Adopt will make it easier for the

- faculty to upload the book or the link on how to access the textbook.
- g. Kelley Brundage: Is there additional costs or licensing for the student modules? Since we are only discussing the Faculty module here? **There no costs involved with any of the Follett Discover modules.**
- h. Ryan Otto: When a student is accessing a work through their LMS, what data is being sent to Follett and the textbook publisher? Nothing is sent to us or the publisher. The Follett Discover Adopt LTI is only on the faculty side. The Discover Access module just makes it so that a student could purchase their books through the LMS. We would only get information that is normally gathered when we conduct an online sale.
- i. Jason Maseberg-Tomlinson: Are all OER suggested by OpenStax accessible to people with disabilities? **Openstax has many materials** that are accessible and are continuing to improve that option. They state that their text are reader friendly.
- j. Kelley Brundage: Assume for those colleges or departments that have asked the faculty to send this information centrally and one person would be responsible for adding that there is that possibility still or would they possibly have the ability to upload a file for their courses/sections instead of adding one at a time? There is no ability to upload a file to enter adoptions. Though if there are several sections or even multiple courses using the same material then it is possible to adopt that material quickly for multiple courses. Books can be saved in the faculty members library making it to grab and drop it in a course. There is also an adoption to readopt what was most recently used.
- k. Kelley Brundage: So we mention manhattan but what shows for students or our faculty that are teaching at multiple locations? Does this account for that? It does account for other campuses. We are taking back over the Salina store so it will cover there as well. That store is a separate store from the main campus. It is still part of our group just managed as a separate store.
- 1. Ryan Otto: Is there a conflict of interest where instructors are mandated to report their adopted course material through the same storefront that sells these materials to students? The HEOA requires that students are able to see the title, ISBN, author, and the price before registering for a class. We are the official supplier of that information as we are the official course materials supplier of K-State.
- m. Katherine Jones: I may just be showing my ignorance of what happens on my own campus, but I'm pretty sure Salina campus bookstore is now under Barnes and Nobles College...? Seems like it might be a complicating factor when discussing making this move all-campuses wide. It will be campus wide. We will be assuming management of that location soon.
